Diana L. Hayes is Emerita Professor of Systematic Theology at Georgetown University. She holds the Juris Doctor(Law), PhD (Religious Studies) and Doctor of Sacred Theology degrees (STD) and is the first African American woman to earn the Pontifical Doctorate from The Catholic University of Leuven (Louvain, BE).

Throughout her career, Dr. Hayes has lectured extensively on issues of race, class, gender and religion, womanist and Black theologies, women in the Catholic Church, and African American religions. She will share her insights on the challenge of racism today. By walking us through stories, experience, and perspectives, Dr. Hayes will remind us that there is only one race—the human race.
