

Thoughts from our Pastor Rev. George O. Omwando



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today, we encounter one of the sensitive topics in the Scripture that is based on marriage and divorce. This is because, divorce does not spare anyone. It affects all of us. I know many friends of mine that are divorced who are living a happy life and others that are struggling. When one is divorced, it doesn't necessarily render or make you a bad person or less acceptable to the community but is a fact in life. The subject of divorce should challenge us in the church to focus more energy and more ministries on the positive need to build strong marriages and to provide genuine caring help to those whose marriages may be in trouble or to those that have recently been divorced. A good friend of mine once told me that losing your partner is like losing a limb. Divorce is no laughing matter.

In our Gospel today, the Pharisees approached Jesus and asked him whether it was lawful for a husband to divorce his wife. In the time of Jesus, it was men who could only divorce their wives. Today, the subject of divorce is a painful reality that has probably touched every person in this Church in one-way or another. It is a sensitive and painful issue, which calls for a careful balance between truth telling and compassion. By asking the question of divorce, the Pharisees placed Jesus in a very difficult spot. The Herod in question, in today's reading is the one who tried to kill Jesus at his birth. What we need to know about this Herod is that he had married his sister-in-law, Herodias and the Mosaic Law explicitly forbade marriage to your brother's wife, while he was still living. You might remember elsewhere in the Gospels when *John the Baptist* criticized Herod for marrying his brother's wife. This greatly angered Herod and, as you know, John was beheaded by Herod since he did not want to know what God thought of his adultery. So, if Jesus denounced divorce, he risked the wrath of Herod or on the other hand, if Jesus said that divorce was okay, he would seem to take away his credibility as a moral teacher. This put him in dilemma and Jesus needed to be extra careful. For Jesus, marriage uniquely brings together a man and a woman so the two may become one. God established marriage to be a life-long, a faithful relationship between a husband and a wife — full of joy, love and intimacy but because of human imperfections, this made divorce necessary.

Let us pray for the families that are in a difficulty marriage, those already going through a tough divorce that our Lord will accompany them. And do remember also that divorce is certainly not a gateway for men (or women) to seek greener pastures. There's no way that divorce is a license for skipping out on one marriage because you've met someone else — someone who you imagine will fulfill all of the desires that your current spouse fails to live up to! In marriages where there is constant fighting and anger, where the pain of being together causes nothing but bitterness in a person's heart, divorce may indeed be the lesser of two evils. Divorce should always and only be the solution of a last resort. Divorce is never good, but it is "good" sometimes in our sinful world as it is the best things that two people can do that are in unloving marriage. I believe that there are times, when human weakness leads to the failure of marriage but God's grace God provides a second chance of remarriage. Remarriage must always be accompanied by careful, deliberate, prayerful reflection and repentance.

Finally, I wish to thank all those who organized and participated in this year 15th annual Walk-a-thon and Picnic. The success of this event was based on their dedication, kindness and the desire to strengthen the community. God bless you.



First Reading: Wisdom 7:7-11

We'll depart from the St. Catherine-St. Lucy parking lot on Sat., Oct. 20 at 7 am. It takes about 90 minutes to get to **Siena Retreat Center, 5637**

Erie St., Racine, WI. If you are uncertain whether you are registered for the retreat (on or off a waitlist), please call Siena Retreat Center directly (262-898-2590) to clarify.

The retreat will finish at 3pm, though you would certainly be welcome to stay longer to shop in the bookstore or walk the grounds. Siena has a lovely labyrinth. Please plan on getting home by 6 p.m.

NOTE: If you are coming from the south, you may want to consider exiting earlier than normal off of I-94. The construction north of Hwy 50 is "a mess" so you might want to exit at Hwy 50, not far north of the Illinois state line. Turn left (east) on Hwy 50 and proceed to Hwy 31. Turn left (north) on Hwy 31 and continue (about 16 miles) to 4-Mile Rd. Turn right (east) on 4-Mile and proceed past the stop-light at Hwy 32, past one stop sign, to the stop sign at Erie St. Turn left (north) on Erie. Siena will be on your right hand side.

Annual Mass Sunday, October 14th Supporting People with Mental Illnesses, Families, Friends, and Mental Healthcare Providers

Mental illnesses, such as depression, bi-polar disease, schizophrenia, anxiety disorders and others touch one in four families. Stigma, the misinformation about these illnesses, keeps people from seeking help, and stigma keeps people from helping. The Mass is for all affected and those who are interested in helping.

The Mass will start at 2 PM on **October 14th** at St Gertrude Church, 1400 West Granville, Chicago (6200 North, and 4 blocks west of Broadway at Granville and Glenwood.) Refreshments and conversation will follow Mass.
