

Thoughts From our Pastor Rev. George O. Omwando



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today we have a second collection to support the seminarians who are studying to be priests for the Archdiocese. This is a very important fundraising activity, like other appeals that we carry out throughout the year. Fr. Patrick and I are the products of seminary appeals. This appeal helps our seminary to take care of insurance costs, to hire teachers, to feed seminarians, to pay salaries of the support staff. I ask you to kindly support this appeal but equally pray for our seminarians and those that are thinking of joining the seminary to study and become priests. Also, on this weekend, we draw our attention to know what the life of the seminary is all about. I have asked Fr. Patrick to share about seminary life and even about his own journey of vocation. Also, if you know any Catholic single man whose desire is to join the seminary, please refer them to me or Fr. Patrick. I will contact them and I will advise them perhaps seeing our Archdiocesan Vocations Director.

Today's first reading comes from prophet Amos. The prophet Amos lived among a group of shepherds in Tekoa, a small town approximately ten miles south of Jerusalem. Amos made clear in his writings that he did not come from a family of prophets, nor did he even consider himself one. Rather, he was "a grower of sycamore figs" as well as a shepherd (Amos 7:14-15). Amos's connection to the simple life of the people made its way into the center of his prophecies, as he showed a heart for the oppressed and the voiceless in the world. More than almost any other book of Scripture, the book of Amos holds God's people accountable for their ill-treatment of others. It repeatedly points out the failure of the people to fully embrace God's idea of justice. They were selling off needy people for goods, taking advantage of the helpless, oppressing the poor, and the men were using women immorally (Amos 2:6-8; 3:10; 4:1; 5:11-12; 8:4-6). Drunk on their own economic success and intent on strengthening their financial position, the people had lost the concept of caring for one another. Amos rebuked them because he saw in that lifestyle evidence that Israel had forgotten God. With the people of Israel in the north enjoying an almost un-paralleled time of success, God decided to call a quiet shepherd and farmer to travel from his home in the less sinful south and carry a message of judgment to the Israelites. The people in the north used Amos's status as a foreigner as an excuse to ignore his message of judgment for a multiplicity of sins. However, while their outer lives gleamed with the rays of success, their inner lives sank into a pit of moral decay. Rather than seeking out opportunities to do justice, love, mercy, and to walk humbly, they embraced their arrogance, idolatry, self-righteousness, and materialism. Amos communicated God's utter disdain for the hypocritical lives of His people (Amos 5:21-24). His prophecy concludes with only a brief glimpse of restoration, and even that is directed to Judah, rather than the northern kingdom of Israel (9:11-15).

Injustice permeates our world, yet as Christians we often turn a blind eye to the suffering of others for "more important" work like praying, preaching, and teaching. But the book of Amos reminds us that those works, while unquestionably central to a believer's life, ring hollow when we don't love and serve others in our own lives. Do you find yourself falling into that trap at times—prioritizing prayer over service? God has called Christians not only to be in relationship with Him but also to be in relationships with others. For those Christians whose tendency has been to focus more on the invisible God than on His visible creation, Amos pulls us back toward the center, where both the physical and the spiritual needs of people matter in God's scheme of justice. God bless you.

God is on the Side of the Poor

Two of today's readings make it quite clear that God is on the side of the poor. Amos describes in detail the exploitation of the poor and needy. The psalm repeats that God acts to benefit the poor and lowly. But Luke turns things upside down, telling a tale of a conflicted steward, about to be fired, who demonstrates his cleverness and is rewarded. Like the community to whom Paul writes in Timothy, these readings are personal, directed to believers, members of the Jewish and Christian communities, who struggle to deal with personal choices about how to conduct their lives. They offer an outline for how God wishes us to live in a world as complicated and as confusing as our own.

Francis' "Evangelii Gaudium" speaks of his concern: widening gap 'tween rich and poor in trouble. It's fair to give the guys a break from debt we'd overturn, spoke the master in Luke's parable.


Francis blames the market for imbalance that befalls us; the system devours all in its way. Supreme markets see us ignore the God who calls us to full realization on display.

The Pope says human dignity and the common good Out-value comfort of the privileged. He seems to simply say the proper use of money should be for helping those in deep need wedged.

The prophet Amos speaks of his support for those in need; the psalm sings of God's caring for the poor. Luke states that servants cannot to two masters accede; man cannot serve both God and wealth's allure.
