Well, let me tell you, these 2 questions lead to a host of meetings, inaccurate information, contention with other 'parties' and generally was exhausting; spiritually, emotionally and physically.

The good news is that the question of what group we will be included in has been resolved and we hope, going forward, to have more honest, open interaction with various representatives from the archdiocese. We ask for your prayers and support as we move forward and that if you have any thoughts, ideas about SCSL, please reach out to one of us. ### OCTOBER 27, 2019 - 30TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**First Reading: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18**

The book of Sirach was written by a wise teacher who lived 200 years before Christ. It is a loose collection of thoughts on various concerns in the life of a believer. In today's section, Sirach describes how God relates to us, and how we are to relate to God.

**Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18**

Today we hear the concluding lines of the second letter to Timothy. This letter was written in Paul's name sometime after his death. Today's passage depicts Paul's thoughts while he was in prison, awaiting martyrdom.

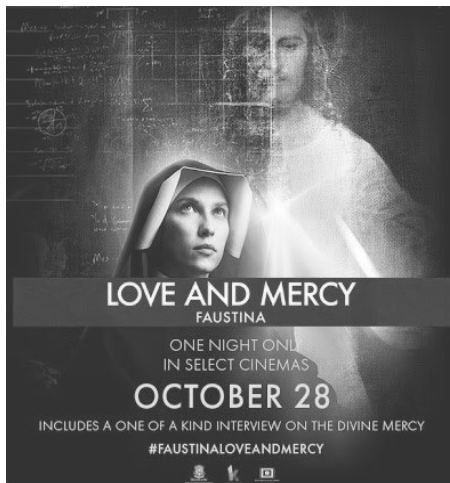
