

## *Thoughts from Rev. George O. Omwando, Pastor*



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

After a busy Advent and Christmas season, we now begin the Ordinary Time of the Church calendar. Do you ever wonder why Catholics refer this time of the year as Ordinary Time? We call this time "Ordinary Time" because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. There are 33 weeks of Ordinary Sundays culminating with the feast of Christ the King. The word "ordinary" comes from Latin word "ordinalis", which refers to numbers in a series and which stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period or time in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ. It is because of this that the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time which is today (is actually the first Sunday celebrated in Ordinary Time) always features either John the Baptist's acknowledgment of Christ as the Lamb of God or Christ's first miracle—the transformation of water into wine at the wedding at Cana (John 1:29-34) and (John 2:1-11). Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that!

As we begin this ordinary season, I will like to talk about our daily Mass. If you are reading this bulletin, do you know that we celebrate Mass in the small chapel every day at 8:30 am? Do you know that the daily Mass takes less than 30 minutes? And when was the last time that you attended daily Mass? My aim is not to make you feel any guilt, but I am wondering whether you are aware of this wonderful opportunity that we do celebrate daily, and that you can come and participate at Mass when you are free? Some people think that daily Mass is for the old and retired people who have nothing to do except to attend Mass daily. Are you one of them? I just want to inform you, my brothers and sisters, that attending Mass whether it is daily or weekly knows no age or one's financial status, health conditions, etc. Mass is one form of prayer! You are all invited to either our daily or Sunday Mass whenever you are free. Please come and join us! During our daily Mass, we open only the entrance on Washington Boulevard; the rest of the church doors are always closed. We do this because not many people attend daily Mass and also because the small chapel that we use daily is located on western end of the church.

Finally, the Ordinary time refers to all those parts of the Catholic Church's liturgical year that aren't included in the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter and therefore we need to participate in the life of the Church so that we can know who Christ is and His coming to live with sinners. At Mass, Jesus gives us a share of God's divine life by giving us His own Blood and Body. The gifts of bread and wine that we present at offertory, through the power of the Holy Spirit and under the hands of priest become truly the Body and Blood of Christ. This is not a mere symbol, but Jesus's real flesh and real blood, under the appearance of bread and wine. Mass is very important in the life of a Catholic. So, I urge you that whenever you get time try to attend Mass on Sundays and even once a while even our daily Mass. God bless you.

With this Sunday we begin Ordinary Time. The readings tell us about God's relationship with Israel and John the Baptist's relationship with Jesus. Israel's relationship with God is so close, so intimate, that it is through Israel that God's "salvation [will] reach to the ends of the earth" (Isaiah 49:6). But we know from John the Baptist that for Israel to accomplish God's will, it must also recognize that Jesus is the Son of God. During these weeks we also get to know Jesus. We begin to understand more deeply our relationship to Jesus and what that relationship means for us, who are "called to be holy" (1 Corinthians 1:2).

### JANUARY 26, 2020 - 3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### First Reading: Isaiah 8:23 – 9,3

Zebulum and Naphtali were two Jewish tribes who had settled in the northern area of the Holy Land. Eight centuries before Christ, this area experienced a bitter defeat at the hands of Assyria. The prophet Isaiah offers these defeated people hope by looking ahead to a day when they would be especially blessed. This northern area of the Holy Land was later known as Galilee, and Christians have seen Jesus as fulfilling this prophecy.

#### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1: 10-13, 17

In this First Letter to the Corinthians, Paul deals with issues the Church faces in every age. After Paul had founded this community and moved on, he heard of polarizations among the Corinthians Christians. In today's passage, he speaks bluntly to them about these divisions.
