

Thoughts from Rev. George O. Omwando, Pastor



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the past month we have celebrated some of the most significant feasts in the Catholic Church that begun with **Ascension of Christ, Pentecost, Holy Trinity and the Body and Blood of Christ**. In these feasts, we have come to learn and deepen our understanding of who God is to us and what has He done for to us in the past centuries. He sent his own Son to come and live with us and redeem us from the yoke of sin. Whether we like it or not, Jesus died for everyone. After Ascension to heaven, the Father and His Son sent the Holy Spirit to us. All the gifts given to mankind by God, there is none greater than the presence of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit takes up permanent residence in the hearts of believers (Romans 8:9; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20)

God gave us the Spirit as a “compensation” for Christ’s absence, to perform the functions toward us which He would have done if He had remained personally with us. Among those spiritual functions is that of the revealer of truth. The Spirit’s presence within us enables us to understand and interpret God’s Word for instance, Jesus told His disciples that; “When He, the Spirit of Truth, comes, He will guide you into all truth” (John 16:13). The Spirit reveals to our minds the whole counsel of God as it relates to worship, doctrine, and Christian living. The Spirit is the ultimate guide, going before, leading the way, removing obstructions, opening the understanding of the bible, and making all things plain and clear. The Spirit leads in the way we should go in spiritual things. Without such a guide, we would be apt to fall into error. The Spirit convinces us of Christ divinity and Incarnation, His being the Messiah, His suffering and death. His resurrection and ascension, His exaltation at the right hand of God.

Finally, in today’s Gospel, Jesus assured his disciples not to fear anyone. Fear brothers and sisters is a key issue in our everyday lives. “What will the doctor find in this test? Will I be okay after surgery? Will I have enough money to get to the end of the month? Will I be able to retire?” There are many fears and we call them by many names: worry, tension, anxiety, or stress. We fear the present corona virus, terrorism, crime, cancer and the list just goes on and on but as Jesus continues the training of the disciples for His mission by sending them out to two by two to teach, preach, heal and minister in his name. He warned them of what to be aware and what they can expect because the Lord will be with them. Life as a follower of Christ in this world is not an easy one. It wasn’t easy for Jesus. We can expect the same as one of His disciples. So, let us not be worried the way we are treated or punished simply because we are followers of Christ.

Lastly, as we gradually start re-opening the church, I ask for your patience as we learn to follow the guidelines pertaining on how to minimize the chances of spreading the Corona Virus. I would like to thank our parish re-opening team: Lynne DesLauriers, Kevin Morgan, Emilia Merchen, Chemetha Baker, and Pat Pomykalski for their hard work in helping to make sure that our parish is ready and comfortable to resume the celebrations of daily and Sunday masses. Also, my sincere gratitude goes to Michael Stryczek and Darrick Allen for making sure that the church is cleaned and sanitized before after every mass. God bless you.




Praying for the Sick In Our Parish

JUNE 28, 2020 — 13TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16

Elisha, who lived about 800 years before Christ, succeeded the great prophet Elijah, and was noted for his miraculous deeds. Today we hear of one such deed performed in gratitude for the hospitality given to him and his servant Gehazi.

Second Reading: Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

In a previous section of his letter to the Romans, Paul taught that we sinners are reconciled to God through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Now Paul notes that we experience this dying and rising when, in the immersion form of baptism, we are symbolically "buried" in the water and emerge to new life.

Re-Opening the Parish for Mass

St. Catherine of Siena—St. Lucy Parish is open for the celebration of our Masses. We sincerely ask you to follow the stipulations below. But first, there is the link for parishioners to sign up. When you receive the e-mail, click on the button to SIGN UP, and please review the available slots on this attached link. Do it as soon as you can because the number of people for each mass is restricted to 40.

- ..#Please come 15 minutes before mass starts.
- ..#Enter the church by Austin Blvd. only.
- ..#Exit the church by Washington Blvd. only.
- ..#Mandatorily wear a mask.
- ..#Your hands will be sanitized once you enter the church.
- ..#Sign-up at the entrance.
- ..#From this weekend on, entrance to Sacristy's bathroom is prohibited.
- ..#You will be assigned where to sit within the church.
- ..#No congregational singing.
- ..#Avoid touching the pews.
- ..#Follow the signs inside the church.
- ..#Please sit on the pews that are marked.
- ..#No Sign of Peace will be exchanged.
- ..#You will receive a Worship Aid, which will be discarded after each mass.
- ..#Communion will be received only on your hands.
- ..#After Mass, sanitize your hands.
- ..#You are NOT allowed to gather or stay in church after mass.

These guidelines were developed by the Catholic Conference of Bishops of Illinois, based on the State of Illinois and CDC regulations.
