## *Thoughts From Rev. George O. Omwando, Pastor*



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In our Gospel, today, the Pharisees try to trap Jesus by fashioning a question that Jesus cannot wriggle out of. They fashion a question for him that they suppose must be answered with a single Yes or No answer. The question was: "What do you think: Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" During the time of Jesus, the Romans levied several taxes on the Jews. There was something called the ground tax – and it was a tax of ten percent of whatever came out of the ground – grains, and wine, and oil. Then there was the income tax, and by our standards this was very light indeed – just one percent of one's cash income (with no deductions, of course). And, finally, there was the poll tax. It was also a flat tax: and it amounted to a denarius – which was approximately the wage of a common laborer for one day's work – and it was levied on every male from age 14 through 65 and on every female from age 12 through 65. It was this poll tax that was the subject of the question put to Jesus by the Pharisees and the Herodians. It was a special tax, because it had to be paid in Roman silver coinage. Other business and tax matters could be paid in copper coinage, or in gold bullion, or similar mediums of exchange. But the poll tax had to be paid with the silver denarius. And, these coins bore the image of Caesar, and they were inscribed with an inscription saying "Tiberius Caesar, Son of the divine Augustus." Now, this tax was a point of great controversy among the Jews. The Herodians, of course, were all in favor of the tax. They were in favor of all the Roman taxes. The Pharisees, on the other hand, were very much opposed to paying Caesar any taxes at all, for they still supposed that they were citizens of a theocracy, and that to pay Caesar taxes was to acknowledge his sovereignty in Israel. But, the poll tax really made the Pharisees angry, because they had to use a coin which bore a graven image of someone who claimed filial descent from a god. For them, to pay this tax involved them in violation of the commandment against graven images, and it also involved them in the commandment to have no other gods but the God of Israel. I think you can see the trap that they Pharisees and the Herodians together had crafted for Jesus. If he answered their question about the poll tax "yes, it is lawful to pay this tax to Caesar," then they would be able to turn the crowds against Jesus, for the vast majority of Jews were opposed to taxes anyway, and the more religious among them had the same aversion to the poll tax that the Pharisees had. On the other hand, if Jesus said, "no, it's not lawful to pay the poll tax," then the Herodians would have promptly brought a charge of sedition against Jesus, the Romans would have arrested him, and that would neatly put Jesus out of the way. But Jesus next turns the tables on them. "Show me the tax money," he says. And, they bring him a denarius. "Whose image and inscription is on this?" he demanded. "Caesar's," they reply. "Then give to Caesar what is Caesar's," Jesus says.

The applicability of Jesus words in today's gospel comes down to this: to what degree, in what ways are you and I giving to God what is his and our nation? Our Gospel today makes it clear that we possess a dual citizenship. We are citizens of two worlds: citizens of the earth and of heaven. There are two sides of the same coin. A failure in our duty as citizens literary constitutes a failure in our duty as Christians. We have a grave responsibility as Christians to keep the administration of our nation from falling into the hands of corrupt, inept and unqualified leaders always. God bless you.



### OCTOBER 25, 2020 — 30<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### First Reading: Exodus 22:20-26

The book of Exodus recounts how the Jews escaped from slavery in Egypt and made a covenant with God at Mount Sinai. While we're familiar with the Ten Commandments as part of this covenant, God also included other laws. Note that many of them deal with how we treat other people.

#### Second Reading: Thessalonians 1: 5-10

Some geography will help us appreciate this reading. Macedonia was a Roman province in northern Greece in which the city of Thessalonica was located. Achaia was the province in southern Greece to which Paul journeyed after preaching to the Thessalonians. In this, his first letter to the Thessalonians, Paul reports that, on his journey, he learned that their exemplary faith was already known and talked about throughout Greece.

## Opportunity for Participation in Northwestern University Research Project on COVID-19

Researchers at Northwestern University recently launched the Screening for Coronavirus Antibodies in Neighborhoods (SCAN) study that aims to determine how many people in specific areas have been exposed to SARS-CoV-2 (also known as coronavirus or COVID-19) and developed antibodies to the virus. The SCAN Study will also help researchers learn if these antibodies protect people against re-infection.

Many questions remain unanswered about the spread of COVID in our communities and the development of immunity against this virus. To successfully answer some of these unknowns, we need the support of our local communities and volunteers like you.
