From Rev. John W. McGivern, Administrator

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Sheep left unattended or corralled will wander off and get into trouble every single time. That is why the shepherd goes to such lengths to keep an eye on them. When left to our own devices, we, too, have this uncanny tendency to wander off and get into trouble of all kinds. When we allow the voices of temptation to drown out the voice of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, we are headed for trouble. Jesus knows us better than we know ourselves, and we need to heed his voice.

In today's first reading, we learn that Peter healed a man who was disabled. This, of course, is in itself a powerful moment, but what makes it all the more powerful is the fact that the healing took place "in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean...", demonstrating to all that through the resurrection of Jesus, divine power and healing was no longer limited to the person of Jesus, but active among his believers.

Moreover, this same Peter who denied Jesus three times on Good Friday, is now the one who speaks courageously and directly to the crowd as to their culpability in the death of Jesus: The quote from above continues: "...whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead." Standing in persona Christi, in word and deed, Peter reveals the Good Shepherd to us.

Through the power of the resurrection and the sending of the Holy Spirit, the Lord was working through Peter. The crowds in the first reading heard their shepherd's voice in the words and actions of Peter. The Pharisees and others in the Gospel did not recognize their shepherd who was right in front of them.

Let us, you and I, hear the Good Shepherd's voice this day. Let us help others hear his voice through our words and actions this day as well. For his voice leads us to life. The Easter season is the perfect time to move from pain and suffering to glorious triumph in the risen Christ. May we always hear and heed the voice of the Shepherd.

Responding to the Call

Do we truly know the voice of Christ? Do we truly respond to the voice of our shepherd with our own distinctive voice? How often we attempt to imitate those around us, appropriating the response of another member of the flock to Christ. Perhaps we need to balance the image of being sheep of one flock with the image from the second reading, which tells us that we are all children of God. What child has precisely the same interaction with parents as his or her siblings? Instead, they frequently do and say things to distinguish themselves in the eyes of their parents.

Whether we use the image of children or of sheep to understand our relationship with Christ, we believe that we are all known and called by name. With this great gift comes a responsibility: to respond to the call with our own distinctive voice, to take time to discern exactly what our call is, to determine precisely what the will of the Father is for each of us.

Saint Catherine of Siena

April 29 (1347-1380)

Youngest of twenty-five children, Catherine refused marriage and became a Dominican Tertiary at sixteen, cloistering herself at home in contemplative prayer, austere penances, and mystical experiences, culminating in "spiritual espousal" to Christ. Then, incarnating the Dominican ideal of "passing on to others the fruits of contemplation," Catherine left her solitude to care for the poor, nurse the sick, comfort the dying, and bury the dead. Increasingly renowned for converting souls and healing bodies, she was sought after to broker peace during civil wars and Church schisms. All this, and like Jesus, whom she called "my Divine Spouse," she died at thirty-three! Four hundred letters and her spiritual classic *The Dialogue* inspired Paul VI to name her, together with Teresa of Ávila, the first women Doctors of the Church.





MAY 2, 2021 — 5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 9:26-31

Earlier in the book of Acts, we hear about Saul (later known as Paul) persecuting Christians in Jerusalem. When he went to Damascus to do more of the same, he experienced a dramatic conversion. It was several years later before he returned to Jerusalem, the site of his earlier persecutions. His first visit to Jerusalem as a Christian is described in today's reading.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:18-24

During this Easter Season, our second Scripture reading is from the first letter of John. In today's passage, the author is dealing with some members of the community who have defected. They seem to have believed that, as long as you have faith in Jesus, it does not matter what you do in daily life. The author directly refutes that position.

As you know, St. Catherine-St. Lucy has passed certification by the Archdiocese of Chicago to begin offering public Masses on a limited basis. SCSL parishioners are encouraged to update us with your current e-mail in order to receive the weekly notifications of our reopened Sunday Masses and other liturgies as they are scheduled. Each email will contain the link that is needed to sign up in our reservation system on **SignUp-Genius**.

NOTICE: We wanted to let everyone know that if you sign-up for Mass after Friday, they will not be on the sign-up sheets.

- ..#Please come 15 minutes before mass starts.
 - ..#Enter the church by Austin Blvd. only.
 - ..#Exit the church by Washington Blvd. only.
 - ..#Mandatorily wear a mask.
 - ..#Your hands will be sanitized once you enter the church.
 - ..#Sign-up at the entrance.
 - ..#From this weekend on, entrance to Sacristy's bathroom is prohibited.
 - ..#You will be assigned where to sit within the church.
 - ..#No congregational singing.
 - ..#Avoid touching the pews.
 - ..#Follow the signs inside the church.
 - ..#Please sit on the pews that are marked.
 - ..#No Sign of Peace is permitted.
 - ..#You will receive a Worship Aid, which will be discarded after each mass.
 - ..#Communion will be received only on your hands.
 - ..#After Mass, sanitize your hands.
 - ..#You are NOT allowed to gather or stay in church after mass.
