Parish Renew My Church Groupings Begins to Meet

Dear St. Catherine / St. Lucy Parishioners,

The heart of our Renew My Church effort is the parish grouping process—the goal of which is to ensure that all parishes across the archdiocese have the vision, leadership, resources, and operational foundation necessary to create an effective culture of evangelization that makes disciples, builds communities, and inspires witness.

Changing church attendance patterns over many decades has left many parishes heavily burdened by operational and financial concerns that limit their ability to have expansive ministry programs around evangelization and discipleship formation. A decreasing number of priests available to serve at parishes creates a need to rethink our leadership model to include a stronger lay leadership core team with proper governance structures for accountability. There is a need to ensure that we have a common understanding of proven evangelization programs and processes that are rooted in Catholic teaching.

All 344 parishes in the diocese have been joined into 98 groupings. Within these groupings, parishes will determine opportunities for collaboration and unity following a structured process for discernment, transition, and building a future together.

Many of today's challenges require looking and working beyond our individual parish. The only way to make sustainable change in our communities is to work together in new and bold ways. Groupings are called to greater collaboration to take on these challenges with bold vision.

Our grouping consists of the 4 Oak Park parishes. Grouping parishes together allows for local-level ownership and planning to take place and ensures that local feedback is present within the process of renewal. Grouping allows for assessment of new parish models. Additionally, parish groupings help strengthen relationships between parishes,

provide a better evaluation of the current realities within their community, make for a clearer discernment of what configuration would be best for their community, and more effectively identify what they each have to share and what the spiritual renewal in their community will look like.

A set of parishes is considered a good grouping if they: are reasonably close geographically, serve the same broader community (e.g. the parishes serve the same public-school district), have obvious commonalities and affinities (e.g. parishioners occasionally attend mass at more than one parish in the grouping).

Here at St. Catherine / St. Lucy Parish, after much consultation and consideration with the Parish Pastoral Council and input from Fr. George Omwando, the 5 members of our parish grouping are: Grace Bishop, Miles Jackson, Virginia Jones, Carolyn Kiolbasa, and Kevin Morgan. All 5 of the individuals have demonstrated leadership and wisdom in a variety of ways in the parish and also the local community.

The first meeting took place on Tuesday, June 8th. There will be several gatherings throughout the course of the next several months. Our goal is to create a few scenarios for what the new Catholic footprint will be in the Oak Park area. Once submitted, Cardinal Cupich will make the final determination as to what changes will actually be made.

I will continue to update you with information when it is made available. Please pray for the success of these proceedings and that they will indeed serve to make a more vibrant, healthy and sustainable Catholic community for everyone who currently worships at the 4 Oak Park parishes.





God's Time

We either pay attention to or ignore "clock time" as we play in the summer sun and note the earth's tilt and the lengthening days. We live by time. We reckon time in seconds and minutes and hours, or we use broader chunks like suppertime and summertime.

God keeps another sort of time. God speaks to us of "saving time," that is, the time of salvation. This sense of time is called kairos, and this time is always now, always present and available, always revealing, often surprising.

This Sunday's readings alert us to the reality and the import of God's time. Ezekiel and the Gospel of Mark remind us that our labor and our plotting and our planning rest in God. For God takes our smallest efforts and makes of them great works. Paul points us to the "harvest" time, urges us to be watchful for its coming, and calls us to recognize that we must spend our time pleasing God.


JUNE 20, 2021 — TWELVE SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Job 38:1, 8-11

The book of Job is a long parable which grapples with the questions of why bad things happen to good people. In today's passage, God responds to Job and in effect says, "I created and sustain the whole universe, including the mighty oceans. So answers to questions like why people suffer are beyond your limited knowledge."

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5: 14-17

Some members of the Corinthian community found it hard to accept Paul's teachings. They challenged his credentials as an apostle because he was not an eyewitness to the earthly life of Jesus. In this passage, Paul defends his ministry as an apostle.

We wanted to let everyone know that if you sign-up for Mass after Friday, they will not be on the sign-up sheets.

...#Please come 15 minutes before mass starts.

...#Enter the church by Austin Blvd. only.

...#Exit the church by Washington Blvd. only.

...#Mandatorily wear a mask.

...#Your hands will be sanitized once you enter the church.

...#Sign-up at the entrance.

...#Entrance to Sacristy's bathroom is prohibited.

...#You will be assigned where to sit within the church.

...#No congregational singing.

...#Avoid touching the pews.

...#Follow the signs inside the church.

...#Please sit on the pews that are marked.

...#No Sign of Peace is permitted.

...#You will receive a Worship Aid, which will be discarded after each mass.

...#Communion will be received only on your hands.

Our challenge in this church and state contention is to remember with whom we choose to ride, and to whom we owe unqualified attention; The coin we flip has God on either side.


