

Dear Parishioners,

I am writing this letter both to the people of St. Catherine/St. Lucy Parish and of St. Edmund Parish.

There is evidence nearly everywhere we look of the great divisions among people in our world and our country. It strikes me that we hold up our diversity as something to be celebrated, and I agree that it is, but it is that same diversity that oftentimes seems to be the reason for our division.

This, of course, is not a new social ill, for as we hear in both the first reading and the Gospel reading from today, that even the elders of the Jewish community and the disciples of Jesus, respectively, were attempting to make distinctions between them that were unnecessary, unhelpful and short-sighted. In response to the division-making among them, Moses responded: "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets! Would that the Lord might bestow his spirit on them all!" Jesus said: "...whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward."

These are important and helpful messages to hear and to internalize. We can all become creatures of habit. We do things over and again in the ways that become comfortable and reassuring. We worship in our respective parish churches and that is how we like it. Now, even the local Church of Chicago is exacting change upon us. We bristle. We shake our heads. We resist.

I do believe that Renew My Church is an important and necessary process for us. We cannot afford to keep so many parishes afloat what with their ever-increasing costs to maintain. We have fewer and fewer priests who are able to administer the sacraments and offer pastoral ministry. Even more importantly, as the Body of Christ, the living, breathing presence of Christ in the world, it is necessary that we gather not in our relatively empty churches, but as a united community of faith. This is both a practical challenge as well as a spiritual challenge for us, and we must confront the challenges and begin to forge a more vibrant and more united Catholic community.

To that end, I strongly encourage all parishioners to attend the upcoming All-Parish Meeting, at which the parishioners who make up the Renew My Church grouping will share with us the new scenarios regarding all the Catholic parishes located in Oak Park. Change is coming and it is important that you attend this meeting with an open heart and a discerning mind. We want your input. For St. Catherine/St. Lucy parishioners, our meeting will take place **on Sunday, October 3rd at 4pm in St. Catherine/St. Lucy Church.** For St. Edmund parishioners, our meeting will take place on Monday, October 4th at 7pm in St. Edmund Church.

The time for "this is how we have always done it" is past. Please come to your parish meeting, listen to the information to be shared and consider how this might actually be an opportunity for growth, for diversity, for greater vibrancy and for a deepening of one's faith. Thank you.

Dear parishioners, we need your input!

As part of the Archdiocese's Renew My Church initiative, the four Oak Park parishes (St. Catherine/St. Lucy, St. Edmund, Ascension, and St. Giles) have been asked to consider various scenarios for their future organization. Each scenario considers how parishes might unite to become stronger together, or what would allow a parish to stand alone given relationships between parishes, and our obligations regarding the best and most efficient stewardship of our parish resources. Each is meant to bring to the table creative possibilities to best use buildings and ministries for making disciples, strengthening and building communities, and inspiring witness to faith in Jesus Christ.

The scenarios under consideration will be published in the near future, and there will be a meeting on **Sunday, October 3 at 4pm,** in the church, at which members of the parish "grouping team" will provide an overview of the scenarios and seek input from parishioners concerning them. <u>All parishioners are strongly encouraged to attend and share their thoughts.</u> This is a unique opportunity to be heard on the future of the Oak Park parishes.



Food for Thought

Promoting the Reign of God

Again we have that gospel that's from Mark, the one about the evil-causing hand. But we've become attached to both of them; We're thankful he spoke in hyperbole. His purpose was to toughen up his crew; The job that lies ahead's formidable. The folks he worked with wanted to achieve; But often they just tried too hard, and ended focused on themselves.

The disciples portrayed their jealousy when once a stranger spoke in Jesus' name. They displayed competition misguided, because the person was not orthodox, nor was he in good standing with their group. Attachment to their rank did contradict the very goal they wanted to promote. But to exclude folks from their mission was not a simple one-time act.

There was a time the Church excluded men from ordination who had physical impediments, also including race, with Martin de Porres an example. This still is so in Church hierarchy, with one black American Cardinal. Disciples blocking of "unqualified" caused Jesus to remind them of the purpose of discipleship.

In Luke 8, the group surrounding Jesus was the twelve "and some women." The role played just by the women who were witnesses to both Jesus' death and resurrection would seem to make it hard to exclude them. And yet today gender disqualifies half of humanity from their serving in particular Church ministries, despite early-Church women deacons.

And so the Church continues to defend it's model of all-male governance, which has stymied evangelization, and deprived it of credibility it could have as the vanguard of justice for women. Jesus calls us to forget labels like progressive or liberal, and abandon placing restrictions on folks who are fully capable of promoting the Reign of God.

September 26, 2021 500 Club Certificates

500 Club UPDATE

We have completed the mailing for the 2021-22 season of the 500 Club! If you are a registered member of the parish or a current certificate owner, you hopefully received all the information about the next season of the 500 Club. The new season begins October 31st, 2021 and continues through the end of June, 2022. It is a shorter "season" this time to align it with the fiscal year. The weekly prize, however, will be larger.

The cost of certificates remains at \$25. each and they are eligible to win a prize every weekend in the season that you own them. In the 2021-22 season the prize each weekend will be \$35 except for three weekends when the prize is \$500. The drawing on the first Sunday of the season, October 31st, will be for \$500. If we sell all 500 certificates that are available during the season, we will have a fourth drawing for \$500 replacing one Help and encouragement after the death of the \$35 drawings.

Just a reminder, our current season of the 500 Club continues with weekly drawings through October 17th, 2021. We can't thank you enough for your continued support of the parish through this fun and socially distanced program. We have raised \$10,758 during the 2020-2021 season with the sale of 446 certificates.

Thank you again for your enthusiastic participation, especially as we are not able to resume some of our previous and helpful fundraising events at this time. Proceeds will be put toward the general operating expenses of the parish.
