

Thoughts From Rev. John W. McGivern, Administrator

Dear Friends,

This is the third Lenten season that we remain in the throes of a deadly pandemic, as nearly 1 million people have died from COVID-19 in this country. People in the United States seem to be as divided and intolerant as almost they ever have. Now, the world order we thought we knew is being mightily tested with the horrific invasion of Ukraine.

Yet, on this first Sunday of Lent, the first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy reminds us that there is hope. We hear that God brought the Israelites...

“out of Egypt with his strong hand and out-stretched arm, with terrifying power, with signs and wonders; and bringing [them] into this country, he gave [them] this land flowing with milk and honey.”

We begin our Lenten journey, then, acknowledging that although we currently face many obstacles and fears, like the enslaved Israelites who sometimes would lose hope, God is with us too, with every step we take, for we believe that God never abandons his people. At the onset of this season, it may make better sense to consider the ways that we may have, wittingly or not, abandoned or distanced ourselves from God.

In fact, this is precisely Lent’s purpose. It is that time of year when we scrutinize our lives more closely than usual. Are we the people that we want to be? Are we the people God has called us to be? As individuals who are ever on the journey toward God, aren’t we always in a state of becoming? If we place God as the central figure in our lives and live from that truth, then we are becoming more God-like. If, however, we allow any number of other things to take the central place that is reserved for God alone, then we are becoming less God-like.

What are those possible intrusions jostling for our attention? For some of us, it may be vanity. For others, it may be our desire for riches or power. Even our American

culture tends to applaud the self-driven individual, often mistaking the healthy and important value of self-caring with the narcissistic tendencies of self-centeredness.

Other times, we may be so consumed with concerns, even legitimate concerns, that even then, God is pushed aside, as opposed to allowing God to be with us in our concern or worry.

For some others, we may attempt to “do” the Lenten disciplines with such perfection that we lose sight of their purpose. The Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving are designed to help us uncover our need for God, to help us discover our desire for God, and to help us become aware of our sinfulness before God.

During these next six weeks, I hope that you will make time for spiritual reading. I hope you will attend one or two of the various opportunities to pray the Stations of the Cross that are scheduled too. Or simply setting aside just a few minutes every day to thank God for the gift of your life and to seek God’s help in becoming the individual God wants you to be.

Pope Francis has asked that we use the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving as the way that we can support the people of Ukraine and develop greater solidarity with them.

On this journey of self-discovery, it is necessary to remember that God loves and accepts us just as we are. In response to so great a love, let us simply make the attempts to return that love by choosing the path of becoming that will help us to become more God-like. Like Jesus in the desert, we, may find that we, too, shall be tempted, for journeys of self-discovery are never easy. With Jesus as our model and guide, even if we stumble and fall, we will persevere. For it is not perfection that we seek, but unhardened hearts and open minds that seek the love and acceptance that God has always and already given us.

Lenten Regulations

(from Ash Wednesday, to the Paschal Triduum)

Fasting and Abstaining From Meat

One of our Lenten Practices uniting us with Catholics around the world! Fridays during Lent are days of abstaining from meat. Good Friday is a day of abstaining from meat and fasting.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

All are invited to participate in CRS Rice Bowl, Catholic Relief Services Lenten program to pray, fast, learn and give. So take a box, fill it up with your unused change and bring it back by April 17, 2022. Here at St. Catherine-St. Lucy the Rice Bowl boxes are available at both Church doors.

MARCH 13, 2022 SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

This passage recounts the making of a covenant between God and Abraham. Ancient Near-Eastern people often established a covenant by cutting animals in half and setting the halves opposite each other. The participants then walked in the blood flowing between the halves, thereby establishing a blood relationship. But the covenant we will hear about today involves God, who will participate in a more dramatic way.

Second Reading: Philippians 3:17- 4:1

The ancient city of Philippi was located in what is today northeastern Greece. Paul's community of converts at Philippi was especially dear to him. In this section of his letter to them, Paul is upset—but not with them. He has heard that false teachers have come to the community, teaching that Jewish food laws and the rite of circumcision applied even to Christians.

Signs of Lent

Each week we are highlighting a different sign of the Lenten Season, beginning with ashes.



Ashes

This penitential symbol has its roots in the Old Testament books of Esther, Samuel, Isaiah, and Jeremiah, and are a reminder of the impermanence of our earthly life. The ashes are made from the burning of blessed palms (from Palm Sunday the year before) and are placed on our foreheads in the form of a cross: it is in Jesus that we are saved from our sins, and are given eternal life.

The Temptations of Jesus

*You who dwell in the shelter of the Most High,
who abide in the shadow of the Almighty, say to the Lord,
"My refuge and fortress,
my God in whom I trust."*
(Psalm 91:1-2)

Jesus said to his disciples,
"You have stood by me during my time of temptations." (Lk 22)

Jesus knew temptation; though he did not succumb to it, it was a source of aggravation. Luke writes that Jesus struggled to live as a faithful Son of God.


As a human being, he faced confusing situations about which he had to discern, and hard choices he'd have to face living his vocation as the unique Son of God. Jesus shared each temptation with his disciples to encourage them in their struggles to live as pleasing sons and daughters of God.

Anyone passionately and deeply committed to the cause of Jesus, will be tempted steeply by a tricky devil, camouflaged under the cover of good ideas. He's slicker than fake news, trying to distort our views. Luke tells us temptation was not a one-time experience for Jesus, any more than for us.

Into the Forty Days of Lent we're invited, with Luke's intent for us to spend some time in contemplation, so to learn of Jesus' decision-making pattern of how to live as he did, as a faithful Son of God.
