

## Thoughts From Rev. John W. McGivern, Administrator

Dear Friends,

Throughout our lives, there are many firsts that we experience. We may not remember the entire experience, but most of us can remember, for example, something from our First Holy Communion.

You likely remember your first date, your first kiss, your first time away at college, your first apartment. Firsts by their very nature are threshold moments, but not only firsts. Some events of life happen and we cannot help but to think of our lives in terms of before the event and after the event.

The death of my dear sister Mary, on September 29, 1993, is one of those events. Mary was 9 months pregnant, and on this Wednesday morning, Mary died from a ruptured aneurysm. As Mary's life was literally leaving her body, the healthcare professionals also had the responsibility to save her unborn baby. Today, that baby, who was aptly named Mary, is 28 years old and thriving. I must admit that it was perhaps the most unusual commingling of feelings, for at one and the same time, I felt the deepest sadness and pure joy at the birth of my niece. The experience was so large, larger than life, really, that it is a watershed moment in my life. I do see life in terms of before and after Mary's death.

So much had changed in an instant. The youthful myth of indestructibility crumbled. Family dynamics changed. Hearts were broken and life would never be the same.

As I read of Moses and his first encounter with God, I presume that, this was his watershed moment. There was the time before he knew God and the time after he knew God. So much changed for Moses. The one who grew up in the house of Pharaoh, would now become Pharaoh's outcast. The one who hung on every word that Pharaoh spoke, now lived on nothing more than the Word of God.

When we hear of such moments in the lives of others

we generally hear the whole story and have a complete perspective. When one is living from, in and through such experiences, nothing is quite so obvious and clear. The future is unknown. A lot of soul searching has to take place. Exaggerated emotions have to be managed. We put one foot in front of the other and we do our best.

Along with the completed story that we all learn after the fact, one that appears nice and neat and clean, what we don't learn about are the sleepless nights, the immobility, the private sobbing at the end of the day, the absolute anger at what cannot be controlled, the fear of what lies ahead, the anguish that accompanies not wanting to build new experiences without your loved one also sharing in it...

Somehow, perhaps miraculously, we do place one foot in front of the other and slowly, we find resilience, we begin to trust again and life even flourishes.

Moses would lead the people out of slavery in Egypt and, though he himself never set foot onto the Promised Land, he brought them to the home that God had promised. We listen to the Exodus story and there is no need for us to fill in the blanks, to wonder about what might have been, for we are handed the story from beginning to end.

I am simply suggesting that there is always more to the story, and in the experience of that more, God challenges and uses us for his will to be accomplished. Wherever we find ourselves today, as we continue to live from, in and through the watershed moments in our lives, we can trust that God is always with us. We cannot know what God plans for us, or how God intends to use us, we simply must stay open to the possibility that love and life with triumph, and somehow, God will lead us to where we need to go and who we need to become.



## **Renew My Church—Update**

### **Working Today for a more Vibrant Church Tomorrow**

Dear Friends of our 4 Worshipping Communities,

On January 28, 2022, we learned the decisions regarding the future of our 4 parishes. As of July 1, 2022, St. Catherine/St. Lucy and St. Giles Parishes shall unite. Ascension Parish and St. Edmund Parish shall also unite.

Perhaps some of you attended the meeting held on March 8th at St. Giles Parish McDonough Hall. It was an informative meeting insofar as it laid out, in general terms, some of the spiritual and practical dimensions to what lies ahead for us.

Now what?

In this brief update, we'd like to share with you some concrete plans that are already underway, and what some of the very next steps will be.

First, you may like to know that throughout this process, we, your priests, (Fr. Carl Morello, Fr. Rex Pillai and Fr. John McGivern) have been meeting together regularly to discuss the ways that we can build the vibrant future we desire while honoring the legacies that our 4 parishes have afforded us.

One of the most recent topics being discussed is the future of Religious Education for our parish children. You may not be aware of the fact that over the past 2 years, the RE programs of all the parishes have been open to all our children regardless of parish affiliation. Sometimes a certain day of the week is more convenient. Other times, a different style of education may be preferred. There are already many options. As July 1st now fast approaches, we want to be prepared for the coming year. Next week, we shall be meeting with all the local RE leadership and determining ways to unify our programs further. Wherever a family chooses to worship locally, our children will have the same opportunities and benefits of a well-planned, comprehensive, multi-faceted RE program. Stay tuned for more details in the near future.

In the not-too-distant future, we will likely be discussing our Sunday and weekday mass schedules. We have the time and the opportunity right now to give consideration to what the actual needs are, given current mass attendance trends. It is possible, if not likely, that some places may need fewer masses. Given the fact that we will have fewer priests beginning in July, this will be an important discussion.

Very soon, we will be establishing Unification Teams. These individuals from all 4 of the parishes will have the important role to support the priests and the pastoral staffs as we envision our new and more vibrant future, all the while ensuring that no one is ignored and no one is left behind.

The list of issues to address is very long and this has only begun to scratch the surface of all that needs to be considered. This is where we are today. We shall update you regularly as we move along. You are always welcome to reach out to any of us to share your thoughts and ideas.

For all of this endeavor to come to fruition, we need your ongoing prayers. Let us always remember to pray for one another and together, let us pray for the Holy Spirit of God to guide us.
