

Thoughts From Rev. John W. McGivern, Administrator

Dear Parishioners,

There are many ways to talk about Pentecost. It is the 50th day of Easter, and it ends the Easter Season. In colloquial terms, Pentecost is the birthday of the Church, for when the Holy Spirit rushed upon the apostles, they became empowered to go and preach the Good News of Jesus; and the Church was born.

Today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells the story of Pentecost that I had always envisioned as a child and the one with which we are all most familiar. Tongues of fire appeared above the apostles, and they all began to speak in strange and varied languages. Today's Gospel reading, however, depicts the story of Pentecost from the perspective of our resurrected Lord. I find it to be a more satisfying depiction in that Pentecost happens directly through our Lord Jesus and in a most personal way.

In the Gospel story, Jesus performed a very intimate act. It states that "...he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit...' "To breathe upon someone is intimate in that it connotes a closeness between two people. It is a personal encounter. It was the encounter of our Lord with the people he loved, and he was giving them a most precious gift. He gave to them the very breath of his being, his Spirit of life and love.

Today, as a grown man, I can hardly imagine a more loving and intimate act than to give yourself to another person. Think of your marriage in light of our Lord's intimate action with his disciples. Think of the relationship of a parent to child. Think of the experience of young love. Even childhood best friends whispering secrets holds something of this experience. The experience feels safe, uniquely personal, and very loving. It is the kind of experience that makes us feel special. It is the kind of action that makes us rejoice, and it creates within us the desire to share this same gift of love and intimacy, Spirit and life with others.

I never much liked to think of Pentecost as the birthday of the Church. The use of this language always struck me as somehow cheapening of its meaning and reducing this spirit-filled encounter with God to an annual party. Upon greater and renewed reflection, however, there is more wisdom with this notion than I earlier thought: Through Pentecost, we are all made to feel special, we are all given a wonderful gift (of the Holy Spirit), we all have reason to rejoice, and a sincere desire to share this wonderful gift with others. Though not a cake, we share in a meal not made with the sweetness that delights our taste buds but born of the sweetness that is our shared life and Communion with the Lord of All. This meal nourishes us and as on that first Pentecost, sends us forth to share the gift of the Spirit until that day when we can share fully in the great Communion of the heavenly banquet to which we have all been invited.

Gospel — Jesus Christ appears to the disciples and sends them on their mission with the power to forgive or retain sins through the Holy Spirit (John 20:19-23)



JUNE 12, 2022 THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

Pentecost was a Jewish feast that celebrated the beginning of the harvest. It took place 50 days after the feast of Passover. Jewish pilgrims came to Jerusalem from all over the ancient world for the celebration of the feast. Today we hear how Pentecost became a Christian feast.

Second Reading: Romans 8:8-17

Today's passage comes from chapter eight of Paul's letter to the Romans, which stresses the importance of the Holy Spirit in the lives of Christians. Paul wants us to remember that the Spirit who will raise our bodies on the last day is the same Spirit who inspires us to holiness every day. Today Paul offers a sharp contrast between life in the flesh (meaning, life prone to sin) and life in the Spirit.

Food for Thought A Step Towards Universality

"...Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim." (Acts 2:3-4)

The Pentecost story proclaims that the gifts of the Holy Spirit empower us to overcome the differences that divide the human community. Paul teaches that every person has the potential to be a source of grace, and to be graced by others. But is it used to bring divided people together? The candle of hope and faith must never be extinguished.

The importance of Pentecost cannot ever be overstated. Jesus' first word to the disciples after rising was "Peace." After showing his hands and side: "As the Father has sent me, so also I send you." He breathed on them: "Receive the Holy Spirit." He made clear forgiveness is the key charism for his disciples.

The word on Jesus was out...they came to see: from present-day Iran, Iraq, Turkey, Asia. Africa, Europe, even Rome.
Acts says 3,000 people were baptized on that Day of Pentecost. All were forming a community of love and service. And with the mystery and the majesty of the miracle of tongues, all heard the word of the Spirit, proclaimed by disciples in the visitors' native tongues. A miracle with the crackle of excitement at the giant leap toward a Universal Church.

We frequently proclaim that we believe in the Holy Spirit. Pentecost asks "How deeply?" Enough to let Christ's Spirit impassion and empower us? Are we willing to be led beyond our culturally comfortable worlds, to form communities that include such diversity and such different viewpoints that we will need and even learn to enjoy exercising the charisms of humility, humor and forgiveness?

May the glory of the Lord endure forever; Pleasing to him be my theme; I will be glad in the Lord. (Psalm 104:31&34)
