### Fr. Carl's Corner



God Bless America ... land of the free! Who are we kidding these days? After more horrible tragedies on July 4 as a result of guns, often in the hands of mentally ill people, is anyone really free from the FEAR of such random acts of violence that claim innocent lives? I feel heart sick and discouraged by what has recently happened. Let us pray for the victims and their loved ones and, as hard as it may be, pray for the ones who caused such destruction. Their minds and hearts must be so dark they need prayers as well.

Cardinal Cupich, in his statement, has given us all some great food for thought.

"Whatever one makes of the right to bear arms, there is plenty of room for prudential judgement in interpreting the Second Amendment so as to enact serious, broadly popular gun control measures.

The right to bear arms does not eclipse the right to life, or the right of all Americans to go about their lives free of the fear that they might be shredded by bullets at any moment. Gun violence is a life issue. We must continue to pray that all our officials, elected and unelected alike, will redouble their efforts and commitment to keeping safe the people they have sworn to serve. May we all respond to this tragedy united as God's children working to build a path to safety and peace."

Until then, we can say we live in the land of the free ... except, just not from fear anymore!

Last weekend, the unification of our parishes began without any fanfare. We did what we have been doing all along, gathering around the table to remember who we are as followers of Jesus, the Body of Christ in our world. This weekend and next, we will take time to visit our physical church buildings, but most importantly to meet and say hello to each other as the process slowly unfolds and new opportunities for ministry and worship together take shape. A key word here is *slowly* as there are guidelines but no manual for exactly how this should happen.

Our bulletins have already consolidated and now share information for our unified community. Please note the staff names and how to contact them. Also, as we try to condense office hours and how to reach out for scheduling and Masses at St. Catherine-St. Lucy and St. Giles, please note the important information provided so communication channels are open and clear for all. Communication, scheduling, sharing information and who and how to contact those who may be able to help you or answer any questions you might have are our focus at this time.

As I have mentioned before, the plan is to keep Mass schedules as they are at this time. As the unification team and staff have more time to review this, my hope is any necessary changes would occur in late fall when the liturgical year changes on the first weekend of Advent. Thank you all for your patience, prayers and cooperation as we move through this process together.

Last weekend, we also welcomed Fr. Robert Carlton to our pastoral team for our two newly unified parishes. Fr. Robert will serve the pastoral needs for all as needed. For scheduling purposes, he will assist at St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy and St. Giles Parish on the first and third weekends of the month, and on the second and fourth weekends he will be at Ascension-St. Edmund Parish. If there is a fifth weekend, he will help where needed most or in both parishes. At this time, he will say the Tuesday 8:30 am Mass at St. Catherine-St. Lucy Church and the Friday 8:30 am Mass at St. Edmund Church, and as needed.

Currently, St. Giles has 8:30 am Mass on Tuesdays and Thursdays (and at 8:00 am on Saturdays, followed by confessions). If you are an 8:30 am Mass attendee, I encourage you to attend the 8:30 am Masses at St. Edmund on Mondays and Fridays and at St. Catherine-St. Lucy on Wednesdays. Sharing these resources are part of the mission of Renew My Church as well as encouraging and inviting others to join you.

Our next unification meeting is scheduled to be a joint one on Saturday morning, July 23. Among the topics will be the "naming process" for our newly unified parishes. While each church building maintains its current name, the new name will identify the new parish as we have been unified as one. I'll have more to share in the weeks to come.

For now, may we keep this in mind on our journey and pray, "Holy One ... wherever you go, we will go. Wherever you are, there will we be. Your love is all encompassing and that is enough for us."

#### Welcome to Fr. Robert Carlton!

Fr. Robert Carlton has joined the Oak Park Catholic community as a Associate Pastor to the newly unified Ascension-St. Edmund Parish and to the newly unified St. Catherine of Siena -St. Lucy and St. Giles Parish.

Fr. Robert Carlton was ordained in May of 2019 by Cardinal Cupich for the Archdiocese of Chicago. Originally from Evanston, he



attended Loyola Academy for high school and then Georgetown University in Washington DC. Following college, he served in the Navy for four years as a surface warfare officer on two ships in Florida where he was also on the US Navy running team. After that, he taught high school English and theology for five years at Fordham Prep in New York, where he was also an assistant coach on the cross country and track teams. He entered Mundelein Seminary for the Chicago Archdiocese in the fall of 2014. In addition to completing the academic program, he coached track and taught religion at Carmel High School, tutored at St. Martin de Porres High School in Waukegan, was a hospital chaplain for a summer at the Children's Hospital of Los Angeles and completed a summer language immersion at the Working Boys Center in Quito, Ecuador. After ordination, he has served as the associate pastor at St. John Brebeuf in Niles and Immaculate Conception in Chicago and has also worked as the Catholic chaplain at the Metropolitan Correctional Center in Chicago. At IC, Fr. Carlton was a coach for the football, basketball and track teams.

Fr. Carlton is an avid runner and cyclist and a reader of biographies. He is very excited about the opportunity to work with and get to know the people at the parishes in Oak Park.

### The paths we have trod, the gifts that we bring!

Our new parish combines three vibrant communities, each with a faith-filled history. We have captured a few highlights here, which we hope will whet your appetite to learn more about each other, the church buildings we now share, and the values we treasure. As a pilgrim church, we celebrate the paths of our past as we move ahead in a new stage of our journey together.

This week, we share the highlights of the St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy Community.

### St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy Community Mission Statement

We, the parishioners of St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy Parish, seek to deepen our relationship with God and to celebrate God's presence in Word and Sacrament.

By accepting all into our family, we seek unity in Christ and seek to proclaim His Good News in the Discipleship of our lives.





#### **History**

The St. Catherine-St. Lucy community has approximately 285 member households, blending the city and suburbs, drawing from the west side neighborhoods of Chicago, Oak Park, River Forest, and beyond.

St. Catherine-St. Lucy is known for its diversity and for welcoming parishioners from different backgrounds, including different ethnicities, socioeconomic levels, and sexual orientations, among other characteristics. Parish members take pride in their identity as an integrated community. A high point of the year is an African American Heritage Celebration each February. St. Catherine-St. Lucy has had a Gospel Choir for more than 30 years under the direction of Julius White. This choir along with the Celebration Choir reflects the rich diversity of cultural and spiritual praise.

There have also been many significant "firsts" in the history of the St. Catherine-St. Lucy Community. The parish was the first in the diocese to hire a female lay staff person. The parish also was a leader in the designation of a female homilist, Sister Teresita Weind. Sister joined the parish in the 1970s, and her spiritual gifts were quickly recognized by Father Carolan and the parishioners. She became more involved with religious services as she shepherded future Catholics through preparation for Baptism at Easter liturgy. Another unique initiative, called Faith & Fellowship, is a ministry that unites people with mental illness and other parishioners in a shared sense of community.

In 1974, St. Catherine of Siena Parish, founded in 1889 as the first Catholic parish established in Oak Park, merged with St. Lucy Parish founded in 1911 in the Austin neighborhood on Chicago's West Side. Together they formed the renamed St. Catherine of Siena–St. Lucy Parish. Although the transition was difficult at times, the leadership of Father Carolan helped parishioners to bridge cultural differences and work through racial divides. This experience laid the foundation for St. Catherine-St. Lucy to become the welcoming and inclusive community that it is today. The logo was originally designed to reflect the diversity of the parish: black, white, Chicago, and Oak Park joined together as one with the Holy Spirit. It was redesigned ten years later to show how the parish had grown together as one, reaching to embrace the Spirit. "Rooted in Faith, Serving Through Love." The two parishes have a history that is intertwined.

St. Catherine Parish was originally established on the west side of Chicago in 1889 at the request of area residents. The first Mass was offered by Father Louis Campbell on Christmas day in an unfinished frame church at Mayfield and Washington Streets.

As the population of the area grew the St. Catherine Parish established several outreach churches or "missions," the first of which was Our Lady Help of Christians at Chicago and Cicero. In 1897, another mission was founded in the town of Cicero: St. Attracta. Eventually, six additional parishes were created from St. Catherine of Siena. One of these parishes started as a second location of St. Catherine Parish. In 1911, this became St. Lucy Church and Parish at Lake and Mayfield Streets.

Sadly, St. Catherine Church at Washington and Mayfield Streets burned to the foundation in March 1917. Fortunately, construction had begun on a combination school and church on Austin Boulevard in 1916, which was completed in September 1917. The church was on the first floor and a school on the second floor. A third floor was added in 1932.

In November 1930 ground was broken for what later became St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy Church. It is a Tudor-Gothic style church designed by Joseph W. McCarthy, architect for the archdiocese. He designed 43 churches and 4 cathedrals. He designed the parish school, rectory, Maguire Hall, and the convent. He also designed St. Giles and St. Luke Churches. The convent building was later renamed Lucienne House to welcome St. Lucy parishioners. This building is now occupied by a not-for-profit group helping women recovering from addiction.

The church includes a baptismal chapel on the northeast side, as well as a small chapel for daily Mass on the northwest side. There is a music room on the first floor as well as a large choir loft. The organ was installed in 1932. It is a Casavant Freres Ltee Organ created in Saint-Hyacinthe, Quebec, Canada. The organ is Opus number 1467 and consists of 1,641 pipes. It is part of the Organ Historical Society Pipe Organ Database, the only Oak Park Catholic Church included in this database. It was exhibited by the Historical Society in its 2012 convention.

The roots of the St. Catherine of Siena–St. Lucy School go back to the summer of 1885, six years after the founding of St. Catherine of Siena Parish. The Sisters of Mercy opened St. Catherine's Academy, the first Catholic grammar school in Austin, to serve families of a growing parish. By 1912, advanced branches of learning were taught to Catholic children from nine Austin and Oak Park parishes.

In 1917, in the period when St. Catherine Parish had two locations, a new church and school building was dedicated at Lake and Mayfield Streets. The Sisters of Mercy organized a grammar school at the new location. Services were held on the lower floor, and classes attended on the upper. In 1934, a third floor was added to the school to accommodate classrooms with an attic gymnasium above. In 1959 the School Annex, now known as Maguire Hall, was built as a combination gymnasium and assembly hall for students.

In 1974, when St. Lucy and St. Catherine parishes merged, a new school was born: St. Catherine of Siena - St. Lucy School. The school has evolved and grown over the years into an academic and religious institution that is the pride of the community, serving more than 250 students ranging in age from early childhood to eighth grade.

#### **Unifications – Old and New**

As we mark this past weekend as the official unification of St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy and St. Giles, we recall another first-weekend-in-July parish unification: the 1974 unification of St. Catherine of Siena and St. Lucy. At that time, a small group of Catholics living at Central Plaza (a large facility for adults with mental illness) walked the half-mile or so to St. Lucy for Sunday Mass. Led by a resident with schizophrenia, the self-titled "Mother Hen" Thelma Gordon, they eventually found their new home at St. Catherine of Siena, participated in parish activities, and in time, catalyzed the creation of Faith & Fellowship. We like to think that Thelma – now in heaven – will see to it that her "chicks" once again are part of a renewed church. We know they will!

And so what exactly is this "Faith & Fellowship?" Our Mission Statement says that we create an awareness of God's presence and care to adults who experience severe, persistent, mental illness; and provide a welcoming sense of belonging through the formation of communities of faith. We are accompaniment (not charity); ministry with (not for); inclusion (not outreach); spirituality (not therapy); church (not social service).

When we meet in our weekly "Prayer Circles" – now serving residents of two additional West Side facilities – in groups of 10 or so, in parish meeting space, sharing our common journey in faith, some with mental illness and some not, we are again in "unification" – unified with one another, unified with our God.

#### **Dodging the Beggar's Gaze**

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself."

(Luke 10:27)

The great power of this gospel story Is in it's relevance for all time, no matter when or where the scene unfolds, who is the victim, and who makes the climb to shining triumph in mercy's perfection; The story's a biblical paradigm.

Is God the Good Samaritan? Meaning... does not the parable a portrait show of Christ's compassion, incarnation and humility, a picture of Christ's mission aglow? There is no bible story quite as clear: When God sees suffring, a divine sunbow of response is unbounded solidarity.

The Samaritan's deep-rooted compassion assures us that God honestly assumes all the stinging pain of others' suffering. Our Eternal First Responder's God...ask Paul! This parable shows God wears many faces which are visible whenever a human's call risks solidarity with someone in pain.

In Luke's gospel, Jesus says to do as he does. (10:37) The Teacher teaches us to look past preconceptions, past stereotypes, and be aware it might be an over-look we least expect to be caring and merciful. "Mercy made tangible becomes closeness, service, care for those in difficulty." (Pope Francis)

Often we distance ourselves from those bearing traumatic wounds of ordinary suffering or extreme oppression. We avoid that part of town and Dodge the Beggar's Gaze. (GIA Quarterly)
