Fr. Carl's Corner



I want to thank and commend our Unification Team for the thoughtful work they have done and are doing. Making time for our *Mass & Meets* and organizing a process for members of the community to meet and share thoughts and values as we work toward naming our new community has been encouraging and inspiring. Please plan on attending any one of the sessions planned. **We need and want your input.** Here is some food for thought as we work through this time of transition.

Consider, what really makes us human? Our intellect? Our emotions? The fact that we have opposable thumbs?

Think back with me to the story of Ezekiel, the prophet. God summons the young prophet to survey a vast plain of dry bones. God tells Ezekiel to speak to them, and the dry bones will come alive. And, at Ezekiel's word, the bones become human before his eyes. (Ezekiel 37:1-4)

But what brings the bones to life and makes them human is the breath of God's spirit. It is the same spirit of God that gives life to our bones and skin and muscles. It is love – a love that finds its completeness in God – that makes us more than just a walking assemblage of skin and bones.

I share this to remind us all, while we have unique church buildings and certain values and practices that our communities hold, the most important reality to consider – is each other! We must never forget it is the spirit of God that gives us life! In our conversations, practices, decisions to be made, it is the breath of God that gives us life and we must see and honor that in each other.

When we feel "lifeless," when we are going through a "dry" patch of isolation or hopelessness, may we remember the "breath" of God in the caring and compassion of community, family and friends. And as we go through the process of unification and naming, which will have its challenges, may we remember to be a prophet of God's spirit in our midst by our generosity, care and respect for each other. By remembering who we are, alive with the breath of God within us, may we help lift up those who feel weighed down by uncertainty and fear.

Perhaps our prayer might be,

From the four winds come, O Spirit of God, and breathe into each of us
compassion, courage and wisdom to build a new reality,
St. Catherine, St. Lucy, St. Giles, a community
where others see your kingdom alive and at work in us.

Finally, something you should know. As of July 1 when we officially were joined together as one new community, our parish finance committees and parish councils ceased to exist! That is because our parishes as we were known have changed and we are joined canonically as one. That means we will be forming a new finance committee and parish council in the months to come.

I value the members of these committees and may at time turn to them for guidance and wisdom. Currently, our Operations Director, Matt Brophy, our parish staff and the Unification Team will help me to stay the course as we continue the process of merging together. Working on administration and bookkeeping, finances, ministries, Mass times, and the naming of our community are some of the areas that we will be focusing on in the months ahead. Stay tuned!

The Lifelong Learning and Adult Faith Formation Committee for Oak Park Parishes is pleased to announce the following series.

INTERPRETING THE FOUR GOSPELS

Peter O'Leary

In a letter to his patron Can Grande della Scala, the great poet Dante identified four ways of interpreting scripture: the literal, the moral, the allegorical, and the mystical (or anagogical). Dante intended for his patron to use these same approaches to understand the masterpiece, Dante's *Commedia*, that Can Grande had sponsored. But these approaches have persisted as illuminating ways for readers and scholars alike to read scripture.

"Interpreting the Four Gospels" will consist of four lectures, one apiece on each of the four gospels in their chronological order, matched with one apiece of Dante's four interpretive approaches. Each lecture will present one of the gospels in its context, considering when it was written and for whom, along with examples of the interpretive approach in action.

These lectures are meant to be informative and fun, and to open up your sense of how you can read the gospels. No expertise or special training is expected, only your curiosity.

Monday, September 26, 2022
The Gospel of Mark and literal reading

Tuesday, September 27, 2022
The Gospel of Matthew and moral reading

Monday, October 24, 2022
The Gospel of Luke and allegorical reading

Tuesday, October 25, 2022
The Gospel of John and mystical reading

Dr. Peter O'Leary is an alumnus of the University of Chicago. (AB'90 (English), AM'94, PhD'99 Divinity School). A Catechist and member of Ascension-St. Edmund Parish in Oak Park, O'Leary teaches at U. Chicago and the School of the Art Institute. Peter has published five books of poetry and five chapbooks. His latest book, ***The Hidden Eyes of Things***, is a book length poem through the Cultural Society and completes a trilogy. 

Food For Thought

Mary's Divine Destiny

"My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, because he has regarded the lowliness of his handmaid. Henceforth, all generations shall call me blessed, because he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. ...He has put down the mighty from their thrones, and has exalted the lowly..." (Luke 1:46-52)

The transformation of all who are embodied into Christ by Baptism is celebrated in the Assumption of Mary, the first human to have claimed the destiny to us also dedicated: Eternal life in God.

Her "Yes" to the angel Gabriel opens time to eternity, history to divine destiny.

The Spirit of the already present promise in the story of Eve becomes flesh in Jesus, with our birth cause to rejoice.

Rebirth by grace, immeasurable and Immortal, a story of hope, initiates the same journey from "Yes" to our share in the paschal mystery of Jesus. We consent to love's challenges, and to new life access, completing our journey.

Luke gives us a strong impression of the character and strength of Mary. She responded to Gabriel she has no husband. He said: "The Holy Spirit will come upon you; the power of the Most High will overshadow you."

Mary, in obedient faith: "Let it be done according to your word." (Luke 1:35, 38)

Mary endured many emotional peaks and valleys, beginning with threat of divorce from Joseph.

An angel reassured him.

Other stress included: long trip to Bethlehem; Birth in a stable; warmth from farm animals' breath; Herod's plan to kill the baby; Hurried escape to Egypt; The Holy Family finally settled in Nazareth. Mary had much to ponder.

Through her son Jesus, Mary had led the way to the glory in God that awaits us all. Her Assumption assures us that we too will be born to glory in the passages we make each day by faith. "My Spirit rejoices."




