

Fr. Carl's Corner



It was good to see more folks attend Mass to "Pack the Pews" last weekend. While we have a ways to go, we have begun to see a gradual increase in weekend Mass attendance. Let's keep encouraging each other to join us at Mass, especially those who have not yet returned. In this week's bulletin, you will find the information submitted to the Archdiocese regarding our October Count that they require annually.

With Renew My Church and Building a New Reality there are many challenges and changes that take place. What we are

accustomed to may shift or change completely. For many, this feels like being in the midst of a storm. Others are in the storm of uncertainty due to illness, loss of a loved one, a change in or loss of a job, maybe a failed marriage or a relationship that is on the rocks. These are some of the many different "storms" we may face in life. We can add to those the COVID 19 hurricane we have been through and which still threatens us as well as all the political storms that we must weather through.

I have shared this before, and I feel it bears repeating now. "RIDE OUT YOUR STORM, God is right there with you. You may not feel God, but you are not alone. Your hurting now, but your morning is coming. Just hold on to Jesus and ride out your storm."*

When we come to Mass or take time to pray at home, we are reminded to hold fast to the hope that is before us and anchors our soul. The world can be like a sea, and our journey of life can be uncertain, violent, dangerous, and unstable. We can be tossed about by the winds and the currents of life. When seas are most violent, a ship has the greatest need for a good anchor. Jesus, faithful to his promise to always be with us, is already on firm ground, awaiting our arrival. The anchor of hope in all situations, Jesus allows us to ride out our storm. We hold on to Him in the midst of the storms of life until our feet our firmly grounded.

Daily pray, attendance at Mass and receiving the sacraments all help us hold secure as we remain anchored in Jesus.



Well, all the Catechists were disappointed when only one of the four Partners showed up. Melissa had already announced that she was dropping out of the group (she does this from time to time but after a period of weeks or months, she returns). Caryn did not answer her page – not surprising, since this would have been her first time and she may have been nervous. Sophia, we were stunned to learn, had been discharged just that morning. So that left only Ramona, and four Catechists.

Ramona is usually quiet, and sometimes heavily medicated. But that night she stayed awake, shared in the Prayer Circle, led us all in a spontaneous "Kum-Ba-Ya," and was unusually gregarious during the Agape. Maybe it was the Spirit at work, giving Ramona her very own space in the group that night.

A Call for SPRED Catechists

SPRED(Special Religious Development) is a ministry of the Archdiocese of Chicago whose purpose is two-fold: the inclusion of the developmentally disabled into the

liturgical and community faith life of the parish and the formation of a small faith community where both special friends and their catechists nurture their faith.

The Oak Park area needs more SPRED communities! In order to provide opportunities for special needs children, young people, and adults, we need adults willing to be catechists.

"I have been a catechist in the SPRED program at St. Giles since 2013, when the program began. Since that time, I have come to know and love our special friends, their families and the other catechists in our program. We share our faith with each other through activities, songs and, of course, prayer. Religious Education Reflections

September and October in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

In the first two months of Level 1 and Level 2 in the atriums of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS), the pivotal place that Scripture holds in our Faith, our lives and our liturgy was raised up. The children solemnly enthroned the Holy Bible on the prayer table, honoring the presence of God in the sacred book given for all people of all times. The children in Level 2 were enthralled by the wooden bible "book" containing small versions of each individual book, that make up the one great book of the Bible.



Presentations on the celebration of the Mass, our great prayer of thanksgiving and praise, were also given in both levels. The children in Level 1 examined various articles of the altar that are kept in a delightful altar cabinet in the atrium. Level 2 presentations included the gestures of the Mass, starting with the *Breaking of the Bread* and the *Sign of Peace*.

Another key presentation in the CGS is the parable of *The Good Shepherd*. Both levels reflected on how much the Shepherd loves his sheep and calls each by name.

The children in both Level 2 and Level 3 sign up and plan a communal prayer service for the end of every atrium session. This special work is prepared and led by two different children each week. It includes readings, songs, perhaps a procession, and always personal prayer intentions.

The children in Level 3 are writing their reflections in journals this year. Presentations on *The Plan of God*, began in October. This plan, for a cosmic communion of love, focuses on the arrival and impact of human beings throughout history.





Spiritual Classics for November: Rediscovering the Saints


