#### Fr. Carl's Corner



What a weekend! We end our Church year on this, The Feast of Christ the King, and look forward to Thanksgiving this Thursday. Next weekend, we enter into Advent which marks the beginning of our new liturgical year for the Church and this community of faith.

Included in this bulletin is a letter from Cardinal Cupich lifting the general dispensation from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass. Please read the letter and know what is planned for the first weekend of Advent. We will have a ritual to renew our faith and recommit ourselves to worship God in-person and to be supportive of each other, week after week, gathering around the table of the Lord.

Today as we celebrate The Feast of Christ the King, we recall that Jesus was crucified for the crime of pretending to be – or worse, actually being - the legitimate king of the Jews. Pilate took the claim seriously enough to post it on Jesus' cross at his execution site. Soldiers and bystanders used the title to mock Jesus.

As we listen to the story, how strange and yet how wonderful that the one person who perceived the truth of Jesus' kingship was a fellow sufferer on the cross! In his final hour, this man, who had no hope for the overthrow of the Roman Empire, put his worldly aspirations behind him. The only kingdom that could influence his fate was the one that Jesus had been talking about all along. It was the kingdom always coming. If Jesus were the Lord of that kingdom, then there was still hope for someone like him.

Brothers and sisters in faith, this story is our story. Luke, whose constant theme is the forgiveness of sins, reveals that we are all condemned and die in our sins until we ask to be held in Jesus' holy remembrance. The power of the Eucharist is what makes what we remember present to us now. This is why coming to Mass, obligation or not, is so important as a people of faith. If we want a share in the kingdom of Jesus here and now, today, we will find it in this celebration of the forgiveness of sin. It is in our Eucharist that Jesus exercises his kingship, and we who are citizens of his reign come to this table. This is awesome spiritual food for the soul! I encourage you to reflect upon this for yourself and most importantly, send a copy to a loved one or friend who has stopped attending Mass, especially those who claim it's boring or they get nothing out of it. Really! When we truly understand what is happening at Mass, why would anyone stay away?

Unification news ... we will take a break during the Advent and Christmas Season. Our meetings will resume after the first of the year. As we have in the past, we will share reports of our meetings when there is information to share.

Know that I am working with Matt Brophy, our Operations Director, and Com Ed on LED bulb replacements along with getting burnt out lights replaced, soon, especially at our St. Catherine-St. Lucy worship site.

I wish everyone a Happy and Blessed Thanksgiving. Know I am grateful for all the staff at our parish, dedicated and hardworking, and for each and every one of you supporting the parish with your prayers, volunteer activity and financial contributions. We are blessed!



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In so many ways—large and small—the pandemic has upended our lives together. Families and, in a special way, young people, have faced distressing struggles. The pandemic made our connections with one another challenging and difficult. Exactly in that moment when we truly needed supportive relationships with one another, we found ourselves separated. Sadly, this included the relationships and connections that we have in and through the Church.

We did our best to move forward and I am proud of our collective response to the challenges of the pandemic. When I announced a general dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday Mass, many parishes offered on-line Sunday Masses, and went even further and established prayer lines and reached out to those in need. The TV Mass that I celebrated helped to keep us connected as a community of faith in Chicagoland. So many of you have told me how healing and comforting those Masses have been.

In the meanwhile, we are in a new moment. With vaccinations and boosters, restrictions on public gatherings have eased up. Many people feel more comfortable returning to Church. Yet, we know there are some elderly and immuno-comprised persons who are still not ready to return. And they should not return. These vulnerable brothers and sisters have an excusing cause for being absent and for this reason I will continue the TV Mass on ABC for the present time. But for the rest of us, I have decided, in consultation with my advisors, to lift the general dispensation from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass as we begin a new Church year on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26-27.

My hope is that the First Sunday of Advent will provide us with a fresh start to take up again our life together as a community of faith that gathers to worship God. I have asked our pastors to begin the Masses on November 26-27 with the traditional lighting of the Advent wreath. After the homily your pastor will lead the community in a renewal of baptismal promises, acknowledging that we owe our obligation to participate in Sunday Mass to God but also to each other. Our common profession of faith and of our desire to turn away from sin, will be concluded by a sprinkling rite with the waters of baptism.

Let this occasion of our renewal of faith and life, which we all so much want, provide us with a fresh start as we recommit ourselves to worship God and to be supportive of each other week after week as we gather around the Table of the Lord to be nourished and renewed.




#### Intercultural Immigrant Ministry (IIM) A joint ministry of the Catholic Parishes of Oak Park.

# Time for Caring and Sharing: CCW Sharing Tree at St. Giles Church


