

Fr. Carl's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

As we are quickly moving through the month of February, and Lent is beginning this week, we are also continuing to move through the process of unification of our two new parishes: St. Catherine-St. Lucy and St. Giles, and Ascension and St. Edmund. Our unification teams have met individually and together on multiple occasions. At our last meeting on January 17, we began to discuss next steps. This marks a time of transition for our respective unification teams as we move forward looking at the next phase of **Building a New Reality** for our two new parishes, and

what we have been visioning for the future Catholic Community here in Oak Park and those in our community who reside beyond our usual geographic borders. Together, we can create a strong presence and witness to the Body of Christ in our support for one another and those in need. While we honor what makes us unique and vibrant in our respective parishes, we also have the opportunity to see how we can share the gifts and talents we can bring to the larger church community that we are a part of.

We can be proud of the fact that we have begun our shared Sunday evening Mass at the St. Edmund site with a focus on young adults. We can be proud of the fact that in conjunction with Housing Forward and the help of members from each community, we have opened a temporary shelter for the homeless in the St. Catherine-St. Lucy rectory. All of this is supported by the Oak Park Village leadership.

And there has been a lot of work happening to build a team, with representatives from each of the communities served, to create a strong Religious Education program that will meet the growing needs for all our families as we work together to pass on our Catholic faith to our children.

There are still many opportunities and challenges before us. But look at what we have already started, and what we have already accomplished together!

Now we will begin our next phase of building our new parish councils and finance committees. Rick Moreno, the Vicariate representative who works with parishes that are in transition, presented information to us at a joint staff meeting last Tuesday, and will continue to provide guidance at a *Building A New Reality* meeting on Monday, February 20. If you have an interest in serving our communities as we move into this new phase of our unification, please reach out to one of us and let us know.

At the heart of the conversation is the reality that we must move forward with a focus on MISSION, speaking about and sharing our faith stories and inviting others to know Christ. For some, we may be the first encounter they have. Friends, we know that change is never easy for any of us. But the church has been changing and we are changing. We are on this journey together. Our prayer is that may we trust the Holy Spirit to guide us, and that we never forget that the center of our lives is our faith in God and our strength as we come together as the living Body of Christ.




FOOD COLLECTION FOR THOSE IN NEED

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Catechist Gathering Saturday, February 25, 2023

"There are various ways in which Christ is present in the midst of mankind, yet the Eucharistic presence has a unique character." And further, "[I]t is only in the Eucharist that the most particular presence of Christ is realized and it is therefore natural that the children are most involved in the Eucharistic prayer when we celebrate the Mass."

So Sofia Cavaletti wrote in *The Religious Potential of the Child*.

With this in mind, we will gather with long-time catechist and formation leader Julianne McCauley to reflect on the liturgical materials we offer the children, paying particular attention to the elements of the Eucharistic prayer. Beginning with those most essential presentations we offer the youngest child and continuing with the work of the 6 to 12 year old, we will explore how Catechesis of the Good Shepherd fosters falling in love with the Mass as we go deeper into the mystery of the living presence of Christ in the Eucharistic celebration.

Julianne McCauley fell in love with the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd when she saw the presentation of the City of Jerusalem and has been listening to God with children for decades since. She is a formation leader for Level II and Level III, worked on the Materials Manual Committee for the Level I and Level II online manuals, was an editor for the Journal of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd from 2010 through 2015, and served on the committee that oversaw the revisions to the liturgical materials for the changes in the Roman missal. She lives in Chicago, is married and has three children. She is currently a Level III catechist at All Saints Episcopal Church in Chicago and for the fifth graders at Ascension School in Oak Park.

Volunteers help get set-up for the evening, greet the shelter guests as they arrive help them to set up their sleeping area, host dinner, and interact with clients until lights out.

Overnight Attendant (10:00 pm-5:00 am)
 Volunteers support staff in ensuring a safe experience for the shelter guests.

> Breakfast Host (5:00 am-7:00 am)
Volunteers serve a light breakfast, help shelter guests exit and assist with light clean-up.

Meal Provider (To be delivered at 7:00 pm)

Food For Thought From Peace to Renewal

"Wherever he went, into village or hamlet or town, they laid the sick in the market places, and entreated him to let them touch but the tassel of his cloak, and as many as touched him were saved." (Mark 6:56)

The heroic mission of our Pope to the Congo and to South Sudan placed the whole world's attention on the complexities of coexistence, and rebuilding of peace. Genesis reminds us Creation began with light, insight and order: "God made the two great lights, the greater light to rule the day and the smaller one to rule the night, and he made the stars."
