Fr. Carl's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

Following our Renew My Church Discussion and Discernment announcements last spring, we've been working with teams from the Archdiocese on the Organizational Structural Phase of Renew My Church. Our mission is to create a solid structural foundation necessary to build a new reality focused on evangelization and missionary discipleship which will include creating a sense of unity in the larger Catholic community of Oak Park.

During our continued efforts to create streamlined financial operations, exceptional leadership teams, and viable and sustainable facility plans, we've learned that our two newly forming parishes, made up of four former Oak Park parishes, comprise a total of 20 buildings in various conditions. Recently, we learned the lease of the St. Edmund School building was up for renewal later this year and investigation began on the condition of the building for another extended lease term. Unfortunately, the condition of the building and the overwhelming investment needed to address the condition is beyond the reach of community and the Archdiocese, and the renewal of the lease to The Children's School is not a possibility. In consideration for the school and the time they need to find a new location, we had to notify the school administration without being able to provide this information to our Catholic community first.

We are now moving forward earnestly with a Structural Review and we are beginning to form our new parish councils and finance committees. As this is happening, we are also beginning to move toward the second stage of Renew My Church, which is the spiritual renewal of Building a New Reality, or BNR. The opening of the temporary shelter at the St. Catherine-St. Lucy site, bringing together our Religious Education Programs, looking toward the creation of a formation center, and the addition of our 5:00 pm Sunday Mass with a focus on our young adults are just some of the ways we are working on spiritual renewal all at the same time. Of course, all of this will take time and leadership as well as continued community input and involvement.

That being said, we have decided to cancel for now our previously announced March 6 meeting as there are still structural pieces for which more information needs to be gathered. In the meantime, we will be creating our new finance committees in order to include them in the sharing of information and the conversations on how best to move into this next phase of the process of Building a New Reality.

We ask for your patience, faith, and prayers as we embark upon this continued journey together.

At the heart of this journey, we encourage you to remember it is Christ who we follow. He promises to strengthen us in the gift of the Eucharist, wherever we share in that sacred meal. We are called to imitate God in our actions, especially in how we live with, and among, each other as communities of faith, hope and love. Let's not lose sight of this as we continue to face challenges as well look forward to many wonderful opportunities.

Signs of Lent

Each week we will be highlighting a different sign of the Lenten Season, beginning with ashes. This penitential symbol has its roots in the Old Testament books of Esther, Samuel, Isaiah, and Jeremiah, and is a reminder of the impermanence of our earthly life.

The ashes are made from the burning of blessed palms (from Palm Sunday the year before) and are placed on our foreheads in the form of a cross: it is Jesus who we follow; it is in Jesus that we are saved from our sins; and through Jesus we are given eternal


CCW Lenten Soup Suppers are back!




FOOD COLLECTION FOR THOSE IN NEED

Feasibility Study Underway

As part of the **Renew My Church** initiative for the Oak Park Catholic community, a team of volunteers from the parishes of St. Catherine-St. Lucy and St. Giles and Ascension and St. Edmund has begun a feasibility study for transforming the St. Catherine-St. Lucy rectory into a social services community center that serves families of students at St. Catherine-St. Lucy School and other West Side schools. St. Catherine-St. Lucy already hosts three social service organizations: part of the rectory is now a temporary emergency shelter operated by Housing Forward: the convent houses a residential program for women overcoming addiction run by Sister House; and Beyond Hunger has a cold storage facility in the garage of the rectory. The study group is divided into three committees: surveying the needs of West Side families and creating a business plan; completing a facility needs assessment of the rectory and convent; and developing a fundraising plan to generate the resources to launch and sustain the new project. - Evening Shelter Host (6:30 pm-10:00 pm)
 Volunteers help get set-up for the evening, greet the shelter guests as they arrive help them to set up their sleeping area, host dinner, and interact with clients until lights out.
- Overnight Attendant (10:00 pm-5:00 am)
 Volunteers support staff in ensuring a safe experience for the shelter guests.
- > Breakfast Host (5:00 am-7:00 am)
 Volunteers serve a light breakfast, help shelter guests exit and assist with light clean-up.
- Meal Provider (To be delivered at 7:00 pm)
 Volunteers donate and deliver a hot dinner meal, and/or a continental breakfast and/or a sack to-go lunches for 25 people.

Food For Thought A Better Option

A clean heart create for me, O God, and a steadfast Spirit renew within me. Cast me not out from your presence, and your Holy Spirit take not from me. (Psalm 51:12-13)

It all happened after his baptism:
"Jesus was led by the Spirit
into the desert, to be tempted
by the devil." (Matt 4:1)
There's a mind-blowing sentence!
Temptation implies confusion
or indecisiveness, which seems
uncharacteristic of Jesus.
Was he THAT human?

Also, why would the Spirit lead Jesus to temptation?
Don't we pray to God:
"...and lead us not into temptation?"
So the Spirit led Jesus to test his identity;
the devil tried to manipulate him to be untrue to it.

At play here is Jesus' Identity as the Son of God.
Jesus' genealogy is in people of God.
Diabolos (Devil's real name as head demon) wants to direct Jesus as to his vocation among his people.
Jesus' baptism led him to explore what the word "temptation" implied.

Adam and Eve tried to achieve what they already had:
They were like God.
Diabolos tried that trick twice on Jesus:
"If you are the Son of God..."
Then he offers an alternative life.
Jesus told him to stay in his own hell.

Jesus' temptations, like the desert and in the Garden, summarize the ways any of us can distort our vacation to be images of God. Diabolos needs to see that our own need of bread and security diverts our attention from the truth. But if anyone is hungry or in danger, we have the ability to respond: Solidarity over selfishness.

Diabolos prioritizes self-preservation over self-giving. His appeal to raw power rejects the ways of the God of Love.

It cannot endure.

At the start of Lent, we recognize we're continually tempted to betray our call to be images of God. In the end, we hope to join Jesus in telling Diabolos: "Dwell in your own hell; We have a better option."
