Fr. Carl's Corner



Dear Community,

As Pastor my primary responsibility is to help you grow as disciples of Jesus and to provide you with tools to help make disciples of others. This is at the heart of the Renew My Church process and the Building a New Reality message as our parishes are united creating a new path forward. That is why this Lent our parish is asked to participate in a survey conducted by Catholic Leadership Institute. The Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey allows parishioners to reflect on their own spiritual growth and discipleship and identify the ways in which the parish

effectively supports that growth.

This web-based survey will be accessible online and in paper form through March 31. At the completion of the survey, our parish will receive a summary report of the results. We will not have access to individual survey responses but will learn about issues that are important to parishioners in a confidential and professional way. The results will be used to look at opportunities to support parishioner growth in discipleship and create goals and plans to achieve that growth.

Please access the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey using the QR Code in today's bulletin. It will take you to a LINK for parish sign up, or directly to the sign up. Everyone in the family over the age of 14 can participate. This is a 75-question survey and will take about 20 minutes to complete. We need to hear from all parishioners! Your feedback is important!

This past weekend, a good number of folks showed up to discuss a mission statement around the idea of an adult formation center for the Oak Park Catholic Community. This is part of a shared vision for our parishes to create for the future. While there were many beautiful thoughts and excitement around the vision and creation of this center, it is clear there are questions and emotions that need to be addressed as we move forward. More discussion and conversation will follow. And more information and clarity as the process unfolds.

One thing for us all to keep in mind is that our church and the structures we are familiar with are in the process of renewal and change. This can be an uncomfortable place to be. Our work together is to create spaces in our church buildings that are centered on mission, making disciples. We have challenges before us as well as wonderful opportunities.

We can learn an important lesson from today's gospel. To see God's wonders in a new way must have astonished the man born blind. John pulls together human discovery and its link to faith. The blind man finds himself moving away from the associations of the past and embracing a new way of seeing. Faith in Christ has replaced the old worship. Perhaps this Lent we can look at Renew My Church and Building a New Reality, this new phase we have begun, and reflect upon how Christ has set us free to live in the freedom of a new vision, one in which we help create. And one that reflects, in faith, a vision where, in the end, all creation will be gathered into God's glory!

Continuing Development of a Center for Catholic Faith

On Sunday, March 12, 75 people gathered to contribute toward the Mission and Vision of the Oak Park Catholic center focused on spiritual growth. Conversation was lively and a lot of ideas for the center emerged. Now a smaller group of people will synthesize the feedback from Sunday, the survey and townhall meeting into a Mission Statement and a Vision Statement.

One hundred and sixty people completed the survey. The responders were asked what their worshipping community is. The following is the percentage breakdown:

Ascension 44% Family Mass 16% St. Catherine-St. Lucy 15% St. Edmund 23% St. Giles 26%

The responses to the questions are being compiled and will be shared in the upcoming bulletins.

"...in every prayer and application with thanksgiving, let your petitions be made known to God. And may the peace of God which surpasses all understanding guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:6-7)

The disciples had seen him in prayer. He would step away, raise his face to the sky, and hold up his arms. It was Jesus the Son, in an intimate encounter with God the Father. It was so much like a child reaching for a loving parent; Jesus was being embraced, and he invited his disciples to share his own relationship with his Father. He has them stand with him, lift up their minds, hearts, bodies and souls, assuring them they're in God's loving gaze. Prayer is a relationship that changes us, by opening minds and hearts.

When we pray with Jesus, we exercise our essential dignity as children of God. By our baptism, we are incorporated into the risen body of Christ, becoming his presence in the world. We are flooded with light and wisdom by the Holy Spirit. When we pray, God hears our voices with the voice of Jesus. "Your Father knows what you need, before you ask him. In this manner shall you pray: 'Our Father, who art in heaven..." (Matt 6:8-13) The petitions of the "Our Father" align us with God's will, to grow in the Eucharist, our daily bread, and give us the power to offer and seek forgiveness. God will be with us always.

The prayer of Jesus is a creative exchange between God and humanity. It uncovers the mystery of God and ourselves as part of the family of God. This is our home base for our Lenten Journey, giving us confidence we are loved and empowered to love one another. That is Jesus' answer to our request, "Teach us to pray."
