Happy Easter to all!

Pope Francis reminds us of what it means when we proclaim that Jesus is risen.

"It means that the love of God is stronger than evil and death itself and that the love of God can transform our lives and let those desert places in our hearts bloom. God's love can do this! ...Jesus did not return to his former earthly life, but entered into the glorious life of God with our humanity, opening us to a future of hope."

"He no longer belongs to the past, but lives in the present and is projected towards the future. ...God's newness appears to us as victory over sin, evil and death, over everything that crushes life and makes it less human. ...If following him seems difficult, don't be afraid, trust him, be confident that he is close to you. He is with you and will give you the peace you are looking for and the strength to live as he would have you do."

This Easter, pray and reflect on where we need Jesus to help us welcome him more fully into our lives and follow him more closely each day.

Let us remember as well what spring is:

- ... a time when delicate roots must push through the dirt
- ... the realization of how much darkness we've survived
- ... the knowledge that not everything blooms at the same time
- ... the astonishment of regrowth and of the forgotten reawakening
- ... the season of hope or trying before you know you'll succeed.

All around us in this springtime season are the glimpses of God who, through the resurrection of Jesus, has opened for us the way to eternal life.






An Easter Reflection

After 40 days of immersing ourselves in Lent culminating in the sacred days of the Triduum, we have the joyous celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. In my readings, I came across a wonderful book by John Dominic Crossan and Sarah Sexton Crossan, Resurrecting Easter. The premise of the book is that the Eastern understanding of the Resurrection as a *relationship* defers from the Western understanding that focuses solely on Jesus. The book is filled with marvelous images that enlighten the reader about how Easter is depicted through the eyes of our Eastern brethren.

These icons represent the Western and the Eastern interpretations of the Resurrection. The Western icon shows Jesus in glory with adoring angels at his feet. Crossan names this image the "individual Resurrection." The Eastern icon represents Jesus in glory surrounded by prophets and bringing Adam and Eve with him in what Crossan names the





The word "Anastasis" is the word used in the Eastern tradition rather than "Resurrection." Anastasis means rebirth -- rebirth in the in fullness of God's love. And, as depicted in the icon, we are reborn with Jesus! We are transformed. Think of the joys and challenges we are experiencing as we move from I-to-We-to-One Faith Community. It is holistic not individualistic. The rebirth occurs in relationship.

How are we moving toward a holistic understanding of the gospel values of Love, Mercy and Justice?


Are we bringing our individual gifts to the community at large to foster the One?



Sharing the Word of God: Christine Wedekind

When Christine Wedekind steps up to the mic to read the Scriptures at Mass, she has a focused intention. "I try to read it as if I was talking to somebody, or as if I'm the apostle talking to a group of people. I try to put some Spirit into it," she says. "When I am reading, I try to look around at people as I read, to share with them."

When Christine was taking a class in public speaking, she told Sister Teresita Weind that she would like to be a lector at St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy Church, and she said, of course. "I feel it is part of my responsibility as a member of the Catholic Church. And it is a privilege," Christine says. "It's a way to minister to people by sharing the Word of God with them."

Christine has lived in the Austin area of Chicago, in Berwyn, Riverside, and Brookfield. She was baptized at St. Catherine's church, went to St. Catherine's grammar school, and married in SCSL church. After getting her associate degree in business at Morton College, she went on to Rosary College, which changed its name to Dominican University the day after she graduated. Later she gained a master's degree in business and a certificate in pastoral ministry at Dominican.

She taught in the Religious Education program at SCSL while her daughter was enrolled and later when her grandson attended the program. At the request of Father George Omwando, she agreed to be the coordinator of the program, a role she continued until 2019. Currently, she is funeral coordinator for the SCSL community. She also is a member of the committee exploring possibilities for the Center for Lifelong Learning.

Recently, she joined in the efforts to communicate Lenten observances and Easter celebrations as an outreach at all four churches of St. Catherine of Siena–St. Lucy and St. Giles Parish and Ascension and St. Edmund Parish. Though she has a lot of ideas and likes to see them materialize, she tries to fly under the radar. When praised for her creativity, she says, "It's not *me*. It's the *Spirit* that gets me going."

On the first Sunday of Lent, Christine was asked to present a short reflection on the Gospel after Communion. Speaking about the temptations of Jesus by Satan, she noted that with each temptation, God showed his love for his Son. "It allows me to stop and think: how many times have I been tempted by the Devil, and God has shown his love to me? Every day I wake and see the sun shining through the clouds and say, Speak Lord, your servant is listening. Help me to do what you would want me to do today by showing your love to others through kindness, honesty, empathy, forgiveness, love. Whatever love You would give to me, let me give it back."

Food For Thought The Resurrection of Hope

"It is a beautiful piece of our human nature that we are so often driven to return, to strive, to persist and to care, even against all odds. Let us nurture the hope that lives within our hearts, while also placing our trust and our joy in the resurrection God has in store for us." (Living Liturgy, p. 97)

Jesus' moment of glory is his devastating death, through which we are given life: His suffering sets us free from sin. This gospel of mercy is God's unconditional love revealed in his Son Jesus. We open our hearts to the ineffable mystery of God. All who believe, all who have faith, will earn eternal life.
