

### Fr. Carl's Corner



As we continue to celebrate Easter and Christ risen and among us, one of the most beautiful ways is by attending Mass and participating in the EUCHARIST. In a book I have been reading, *Living with Real Presence* by S. James Meyer, he offers some profound and interesting thoughts I want to share with you. He writes, "If our experience of Eucharist does not reflect our actual life experience, then we are being disingenuous about Eucharist and dishonest about our lives. Or both."

Meyer continues, "I wonder if we struggle to understand Eucharist in church because we don't first open ourselves up to Eucharist in the world. If we close ourselves to the basic humanity in one another, how will we ever see the Divinity in bread and wine?"

We bring ourselves, who we are and whatever is happening in our lives, to the table when we come together at Mass. Joy or sorrow, the good times and bad, our struggles, uncertainties and doubts, we bring it all and recognize we are companions on this journey of faith. And in all our life experiences, we are encountering EUCHARIST, the Risen Christ among us. What a lesson for parents to model for their children and to remind ourselves of.

Meyer writes, "Eucharist is so much more meaningful when we bring our own flesh and blood to it, when we bring the real presence of our own human experience of brokenness and vulnerability, when we come giving the fruit of our labors and the work of our hands, when we offer ourselves up in love for and with one another."

What a gift we have in the Eucharist! As we make our way from this table into the week ahead, be aware of how *living with real presence* reminds us that our lives, Christ's life, and all lives are united in a sacred communion with our creator and creation.

Have a great week ahead.

#### "BIG SHEBANG" - ???


