

Fr. Carl's Corner

Congratulations to Deacon John Walters and his wife Barbara! Deacon John was ordained to the diaconate on April 30, 1988. John is celebrating 35 years as a deacon and supporting him along the way has been his wife, Barb. Thank you both for your example of faith and dedication to the church and the diaconate.

Speaking of anniversaries, April and May are the months for most ordinations in the Archdiocese. As you have seen in the bulletin, Fr. Ed, Fr. Tom and I all share the same anniversary date, May 7. This is what we will celebrate at a shared Mass next Sunday, May 7, at 10:30 am. There will be a reception in McDonough Hall following Mass.

I would ask you to please keep all of us celebrating anniversaries in your thoughts and prayers this month. Fr. Robert Carlton, May 19, 2019, 4 years; Fr. Brian Taber who says Mass at our St. Giles site, June 3, 2017, 6 years; and Fr. Tom Walsh who says Mass at our St. Catherine-St. Lucy site, May 24, 1986, 37 years.

We also celebrate our deacons, William Pouncy (wife Abbie), May 16, 2004, 19 years; Kevin Morgan (wife Marci), May 14, 2022, 1 year! Now retired, John Henricks (wife Lois) served us for many years. His anniversary is May 1, 1993, 30 years.

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY TO ALL! Thank you for your service and ministry to the community and the parishes served.

April 30 brings an end to the lease on our temporary shelter at the rectory at our St. Catherine-St. Lucy campus. This transitional shelter has gone well in large part due to the support of many volunteers who helped with meals and other needed essentials. The monetary donations received were very helpful as well. While Housing Forward did help defray the cost of our utility bills, we incurred other expenses that have amounted to approximately \$35,000. We have been able to fund all but about \$5,000 of those expenses. If you would like to help us cover this small deficit, please send a gift to the office with "Shelter donation" marked on the envelope. Any donation will be welcomed.

I am also happy to announce that we have signed a year lease with Housing Forward that will allow the shelter to remain open for the coming year. We are building a good partnership with them as they work with those in need, many who desire to grow out of their challenging situations. Once again, this space is being utilized for good and Housing Forward is helping with utilities and a modest income to assist with other expenses. I hope you can agree, what a beautiful way to utilize this valuable space at this time.

Finally, we have all heard the expression, "When one door closes, another door opens." There is another part to that quote that makes sense to me as we live life. God may open doors in our lives, but we have to get up and move toward and through that opening! What an interesting phrase to remember as we walk together through the many expected and unexpected aspects of Renew My Church and now Building a New Reality. As we work toward a united Religious Education program and the creation of a Formation Center where ministries and talents can be shared, along with the cost of programs, let us recognize the "open doors" and the blessings and opportunities set before us. Will we have the courage to move toward these "openings?"

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday and Jesus reminds us that we matter. He knows our name and we are worth saving. God is a friend to all and trusts us to return that love. One of the main goals of any parish is to help others come to know Jesus and build a relationship with him. As we learn to listen to the Shepherd's voice, we are nourished and renewed to live our lives of faith with eagerness and passion. We then can give to others in our lives what we received from Jesus who is kind and considerate of us in so many ways.

I know that many decisions still need to be made as we unify our new parish communities. There are opportunities and challenges as we work toward greater participation in our parishes and in our efforts to create a new reality within our larger Oak Park Catholic Community and beyond. But as we hear about the Good Shepherd today, let us find strength trusting that the Good Shepherd is always present to help and guide us. It is true when one door closes, Jesus, the Good Shepherd, will open another – for the Lord is our Shepherd and there is nothing we shall want!

Reflect on... When God opens a door, do you regularly get up and move toward it? Move toward the door of McDonough Hall on Monday evening, May 1, at 7:00 pm. Food For Thought The Theology of Liberation

Jesus came to Nazareth...and entered the Synagogue on the Sabbath and stood up to read. And the volume of Isaiah the prophet was handed to him... he found the place where it was written:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me because he has anointed me; to bring good news to the poor he has sent me, to proclaim to the captives release, and sight to the blind; to set at liberty the oppressed..."

And he said to them: "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." (Luke 4:16-21)

The apostles were thrown into jail for preaching of Jesus in the Temple, but they were mysteriously set free that same night from their locked and guarded cell. The resurrection's power clearly showed.

Luke's account from Acts 5 parallels the scene from the tomb.

Despite the stone that sealed its entrance, and with guards, the risen Lord emerges, escaping both his death and entombment. His mission (above) is "set captives free."

He will lead us on the path to freedom from the most basic of captivities of all. death.

Jesus granted liberation's power to all his followers: freedom from fear, from oppression, and attempts to define and limit the transformation they're including you and announcing by the way that they live.

Liberation's concept is contentious in the Church.

Opponents of "liberation theology"
say it reduces the resurrection's
spiritual meaning to a freedom
movement in this world. The Church should not take sides
in national matters, and Jesus Christ
should not be seen only in a social
mover light.

Proponents of liberation theology say the Gospel's meaningless if it doesn't change the actual lives of people in this world, especially the poor and the oppressed, due to injustice and violent repression.

Christ identified with the poor; should not the Church also?

Pope Francis said we must work for the actual, social liberation of the world's poor.

Jesus' words say he was sent not to condemn this world, but to save it. Freedom to live freely is part of the liberation for all people.

Risen life begins here.
