

Fr. Carl's Corner



As you heard last weekend in the announcements, the Archdiocese has announced the return of the distribution of the Blood of Christ, the communion cup. We are planning to begin offering the Precious Blood at Masses beginning on the Feast of Pentecost, which is next weekend, May 27-28. We will begin with two stations on each side of the church. This is a good time to remind everyone that reception of the Body of Christ is full participation in the Eucharist, meaning it is both Body and Blood received. Partaking in the cup is a fuller

identification with the invitation, take and eat, take and drink. Just as before the pandemic, we support each person's individual decision to partake or not in the cup.

This is also a good time to examine your desire to help in the liturgical ministries as a communion minister or lector, reading at mass. Because of the pandemic, many former communion ministers and lectors stepped away and we now need to add new members to the ranks. We need and desire participation from the members of the community in these vital roles at Mass.

I also want to share some information that was received from the Archdiocese of Chicago. This will be shared in both Oak Park parish bulletins this weekend.

"We know that the Oak Park parishioners are interested in next steps in addressing the unfortunate situation at St. Edmunds Church which suffered significant damage from a micro-burst storm just prior to Easter. The property has been secured and the loose stones have been secured in place on the structure. Each of these stones weighs several hundred pounds. To ensure everyone's safety, the church remains closed and parish activities have been transferred to the Ascension campus.

The Archdiocese has commissioned a structural engineering and architectural firm to perform a complete assessment of the exterior of the building, not just the damage from the April storm. An interior assessment will be done concurrently. We expect the assessment to be complete in July.

Once the assessments are complete, we will be able to assess the findings, costs, and potential timetable, etc. and develop options for moving forward. We will continue to work with the Village of Oak Park as part of the process. We are grateful for your understanding and support."

This information is from the Archdiocese. I am glad they are keeping us updated and realize there is not much new information at this time. The process is slow, patience is a virtue that is needed and one that will be tested!

Today in our readings, we are reminded with the Ascension, Jesus not only returns to his Father but does so as the Risen Lord! From this great moment on, all humanity has a place in the eternal life of God. For now, one like us has ascended and taken his place at the right hand of the Father. Where in our mind, hearts and souls do we need today's celebration to fill us with peace and hope in the eternal life of God?

Have a beautiful week ahead. With you a Christian. For you a priest.



The opportunities for this shelter are:

> Site Captain

Site captains recruit and manage a team of volunteers from their congregation to fill volunteer needs and/or meals for a night of shelter operation.

- > Evening Shelter Host (6:30 pm-10:00 pm)
 - Volunteers help get set-up for the evening, greet the shelter guests as they arrive help them to set up their sleeping area, host dinner, and interact with clients until lights out.
- Overnight Attendant (10:00 pm-5:00 am)
 Volunteers support staff in ensuring a safe experience for the shelter guests.
- > Breakfast Host (5:00 am-7:00 am)
 Volunteers serve a light breakfast, help shelter guests exit and assist with light clean-up.
- Meal Provider (To be delivered at 7:00 pm)
 Volunteers donate and deliver a hot dinner meal, and/or a continental breakfast and/or a sack to-go lunches for 15 people.



Loaves and Fishes by Dorothy Day is the Spiritual Classics choice for our next discussion on **Tuesday**, **June 6**, at **7:30 pm** over Zoom. The discussion will be led by Marci Madary, Director of Lifelong Formation at St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy and St. Giles Parish in Oak Park. All Oak Park parishes are welcome.

Dorothy Day was an American journalist and social activist who became a Catholic and continued a life of activism. In the 1930s, Day worked closely with fellow activist Peter Maurin to establish the Catholic Worker movement which today continues to provide direct aid for the poor and homeless. *Loaves and Fishes* is full of memorable stories about Dorothy Day and the Catholic Worker movement, based on poignant examples and inspired descriptions of individuals in the movement. A revered figure within the U.S. Catholic community, Day's cause for canonization was recently opened by the Catholic Church.

Return Your Filled Baby Bottles!



Intercultural Immigrant Ministry: Planning to Host Another Migrant Family

The Catholic Parishes of Oak Park (St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy and St. Giles Parish and Ascension and St. Edmund Parish) are submitting a request for funding to Catholic Charities to partially support a second migrant family for at least six months. Catholic Charities will act as case management, ensuring that the family is complying with all legal migrant requirements and applying for any benefits to which they are entitled. They will also accompany the parish team, identifying families who will be good fits for the program, training the mentors, helping to secure an apartment, and maintaining regular communication with the parish team.

Volunteers are needed to accompany the family during their first few months in activities such as shopping, using public transportation, assisting with communication, and becoming comfortable with a new area and language. Ability to speak Spanish is ideal but not required. Finding and moving needed furniture and household items will also require volunteer assistance. Children will need to be enrolled in school and accompanied. Ongoing fundraising will be needed to support the family.

Food For Thought Worshiping and Doubting

"May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of Glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened, that you may know what is the hope that belongs to his call... God put all things beneath his feet, and gave him as head over all things to the Church, which is his body..."

(Ephesians 1:17:23)

The significance of today's readings cannot be overstated:
They mark the very beginning of our beloved Catholic Church.
"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them... and teaching them all that I have commanded you."
(Matthew 28:20)

Following his resurrection,
Jesus appeared to his disciples,
telling them he'd passed through death,
and was teaching them again: "The reign
of God is among you." (Luke 17:21)
Going to a mountain of encounter with God,
they were reconstituted for Pentecost;
On that threshold of faith were worship and doubt.

The disciples saw Jesus, and truly came home, as with doubt and confusion, joy and wonder, they encountered the one who knew and loved them like no other. His message about the path to deep belief was to step out and walk on the water of faith in the one who sends you into his mission that unfailing love was the only genuine power.

Paul's letter has God's iteration of the Word, putting all things under Jesus' feet (above). Ephesians tells us faith in Jesus is really "...a belief in and through the community that is his body." The Ascension reminds us that our vocation is to continue being and seeing God with us "until the end of ages."

Prayer: All powerful God, amidst shouts of joy and a blare of trumpets, you were lifted into the sky by a cloud, promising one day to return.

As we who remain set about the mission you gave us, grant us zeal, persistence and patience.

Through us, may the whole world come to know your good news. Amen.
