

Fr. Carl's Corner



I hope all have enjoyed these beautiful days reminding us of the gift and beauty of God's creation. While the sunshine and nice temperatures have made me smile, I also have a heavy heart as I must share some important information with you. Last week, I spoke to the members of our community who attend the 5:00 pm Mass at our St. Catherine-St. Lucy worship site. After almost a year, with the hope more parishioners who have been away during the pandemic would return to that Mass time, we are still a very small number. Regrettably, after

consultation with staff and members of the community whom I personally spoke with, the 5:00 pm Mass will end as of June 24. Julius White and the Praise Choir have been a significant part of that Mass time and of the community, faithfully providing music for many years. We understand the importance of coming together in worship and the spiritual nourishment that this Mass in particular provides. However, continuing as is with little attendance and support played into making this difficult decision. I understand that for many this will be disappointing.

I can share with you that Julius White and Sue Kaszynski, both involved in the music ministry at our two worship sites, the Praise Choir and our united Seasonal Planning Liturgy team will have conversations on how best to continue to include what has been an important part of the community for many years. Nothing will change with the 9:00 am Sunday morning Mass at St. Catherine-St. Lucy.

I hope and pray that those who have been regular 5:00 pm Mass attendees will now join us at the 4:30 pm Mass at our St. Giles site or the Sunday morning 9:00 am Mass at St. Catherine-St. Lucy. Building a new reality is a process ... we are on that journey together.

This weekend, we celebrate Pentecost and hear some helpful advice for our journey. What is the first thing Jesus says to his startled, confused disciples? "PEACE BE WITH YOU." He says it twice! In this same meeting, the disciples receive the Holy Spirit and Jesus once again "sends" them on a mission. The great reminder of Pentecost is that Christians are a *sent* people. And the impetus of Renew My Church and Building a New Reality is sending us in new directions and on a new mission. In all that we are doing, let us recall that we are commissioned to take Jesus Christ with us and introduce Jesus wherever we go. But we cannot do this until Jesus has said to us, "SHALOM!" PEACE BE WITH YOU.

I understand that with change and a new way of thinking of ourselves as "united" and being church in a more "Oak Park" community way may be challenging. These are all new ideas from what we have been used to as just our individual parish communities. For this reason, and many other personal concerns we carry, many of us are not at peace. We're fractured, confused and just as muddled as the disciples were in today's readings. When we pass the peace of Christ at Mass, wherever we gather, it is not an idle exercise. It is a call to wholeness so that we might be equipped to bring Jesus to one another and to the world.

Have a safe and enjoyable Memorial Day weekend. Let summer begin and may it be relaxed, fun and safe for all! Summer courtyard concerts will begin in June on the third Friday of each month! Keep your eye open for details!!

Reflection

Last week, we heard in the readings that after Jesus ascended into heaven, the apostles were left looking at the sky in wonder and confusion. Maybe they were looking for answers; maybe they were just in shock. How often do we feel like just standing and looking up at the sky? Are we paralyzed, huddled in an upper room, waiting for our next instruction, hoping for a sign in the heavens?

Fear does not have the final word. The Holy Spirit breaks through our fear with a transforming fire - a fire that gives the disciples the strength to go out into a hostile word and spread the amazing News of the great love of God. We, too, are given that flame of the Spirit in our Baptism; we, too, are given everything we need to bring God's presence to the world.

Questions

As we celebrate the gifts of the Spirit in Pentecost, reflect:

What gifts have you received from the Holy Spirit? What gifts do you see in your family and friends?

What would it look like if our parish community was "Filled with the Spirit?" How can we be open to the manifestations of the Spirit in our parish?

You are invited this week to spend time in prayer and reflection pondering the Scripture readings and discerning how God is at work within you, in your life and relationships. What is the Spirit calling you to, in your life, today?

Update from the Parish Operations Director

A part of Parish Operations is facility management, maintenance, and repair.

St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy and St. Giles Parish has one Facilities Committee made up of members of both church worship sites.

At the St. Catherine-St. Lucy site, a number of facility repairs or maintenance has been completed or will be completed in the next four weeks:

The Church sound system has been serviced and repaired.

Two wireless microphones were purchased and installed for the deacon and priest.

LED lighting was installed in all church light fixtures.

The front vestibule of Church was professionally cleaned before Easter.

The gardens in front of the Church have been worked on by a local landscaper.

Coping/flashing on the Church roof has been refashioned and replaced.

A new boiler for the Rectory will be installed in June (with an \$85,000 grant from the Archdiocese).

The exterior doors of the Church have been sanded and refinished.

The Rectory was prepared for a shelter used by Housing Forward. (Pictured at right, top to bottom: SCSL Church front vestibule, the old boiler at the SCSL Rectory, damaged coping/flashing on the SCSL Church roof.)

At the St. Giles site the following projects have been started as we move into spring and summer repairs:

Installation of drain tile and two sump pumps in the crawl space of the Gleeson Building at 1101 Columbian. The building has an excessively high percentage of humidity due to water that doesn't drain properly in the crawl space.

Installation of a new condensate and vacuum pump for the boilers that heat the following buildings: Corrigan, Frawley, the Church and Rectory (pictured below). The current vacuum and condensate pump has reached its life expectancy and has leaks that cannot be repaired. The unit is located behind the boilers in the Frawley Building at 1034 Linden.

Painting of all classrooms and the band room in the Corrigan Building at 1030 Linden.

Painting of the school library on the second floor of the Dore Parish Center at 1025 Columbian.

Replacement of original plumbing (1928) hot and cold water lines in the lower level of the Frawley Building. Currently there is only one water shut off for three buildings: Frawley, the Church and Rectory. For a recent plumbing problem, we had to shut down all three buildings to fix a toilet that wouldn't shut off. This job was put on hold last year by the Facilities Committee, but recent plumbing issues have escalated the project to the top of the list.

New fencing will be installed on the preschool playground behind the Gleeson Building. The old wooden fencing is worn and is a safety hazard for our children.

Installation of soft surface material for the Corrigan

playground on top of the rubber mulch. The soft surface playground material will be a safety feature for the children.

Tear up and replace the black top on the Corrigan playground with a new blacktop. The current blacktop is uneven and a fall hazard for all that use the playground. Trimming of trees on the main parking lot across from the Church. Possible replacement

of the chain link fence and additional benches placed throughout the campus.

I would like to thank the Facilities Committee for their expertise in reviewing the project needs, determining what projects are more immediate, and working with Fr. Carl and me, as well as the Archdiocese Office of Facilities and Construction.

THE "CENTER" FOR LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION SURVEY RESULTS

QUESTION 4: IF THERE IS ONE THING THE CHURCH COULD OFFER YOU, WHAT WOULD THAT BE?

116 people responded to this question. Respondents could write what they wanted in a free text answer. Several themes emerged, summarized below. These responses are quoted and paraphrased from what respondents wrote in their surveys, and grouped based on themes.

- Places for people to share their gifts of all kinds
- Guiding people in how to live the Eucharist in our complex world

- Opportunities for prayer and quiet time
- Relevant liturgies addressing today's issues
- Mass and the Eucharist as central to our faith
- Improved sound systems for the experience of Mass
- Engaging, inclusive, and theologically sound preaching
- Transcendance
- · Variety of Masses including Latin
- · Daily access to Sacraments

Welcome and Acceptance

- Inclusive to all people, love and acceptance
- · Outreach to the most diverse Catholics
- Hospitality
- · Living the motto "All are Welcome"
- Safe place to renew connection with God, even if estranged.

Other comments: Many people commented that the church is serving their needs well, and could not think of anything to add. Others spoke of a disillusionment with the church. Several spoke of a need for true listening, change of church policies, and transparency and servant leadership.



The opportunities for this shelter are:

- > Site Captain
 - Site captains recruit and manage a team of volunteers from their congregation to fill volunteer needs and/or meals for a night of shelter operation.
- Evening Shelter Host (6:30 pm-10:00 pm)
 Volunteers help get set-up for the evening, greet the shelter guests as they arrive help them to set up their sleeping area, host dinner, and interact with clients until lights out.
- Overnight Attendant (10:00 pm-5:00 am)
 Volunteers support staff in ensuring a safe experience for the shelter guests.
- Breakfast Host (5:00 am-7:00 am)
 Volunteers serve a light breakfast, help shelter guests exit and assist with light clean-up.
- Meal Provider (To be delivered at 7:00 pm)
 Volunteers donate and deliver a hot dinner meal, and/or a continental breakfast and/or a sack to-go lunches for 15 people.

Loaves and Fishes by Dorothy Day is the Spiritual Classics choice for our next discussion on **Tuesday**, **June 6**, at 7:30 pm over Zoom. The discussion will be led by Marci Madary, Director of Lifelong Formation at St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy and St. Giles Parish in Oak Park. All Oak Park parishes are welcome.

Dorothy Day was an American journalist and social activist who became a Catholic and continued a life of activism. In the 1930s, Day worked closely with fellow activist Peter Maurin to establish the Catholic Worker movement which today continues to provide direct aid for the poor and homeless. *Loaves and Fishes* is full of memorable stories about Dorothy Day and the Catholic Worker movement, based on poignant examples and inspired descriptions of individuals in the movement. A revered figure within the U.S. Catholic community, Day's cause for canonization was recently opened by the Catholic Church.

Food For Thought A Ray of Light Divine

"Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love." (Pentecost Gospel Acclamation)

This is our Pentecost Song, as we celebrate all creation in a revelation of God's very being: "From the beginning of the world, the mystery of Christ is at work... in the natural world." (Francis, "Laudato Si") Despite finding God in all things, Francis warns us in "Fratelli Tutti," we imagine dread beyond our walls: an ancient culture differing from ours. Sounding like a direct warning, he says in "Fratelli Tutti:"
"Those who have walls become slaves within those walls they have built, lacking interchange with others."

The Spirit if God rids them of inertia, and impels and tasks them in their apostleship, to broaden horizons, continuing for centuries, sending disciples, impelled by the Spirit, to all peoples and cultures of the world.

At each step, Christians needed to broaden their outlook, and question their dogmatic assumptions.

Paul describes that process in 1 Corinthians, when he speaks of rejoicing in the Spirit's diverse gifts.

Today all the world is reachable, and translations are instant.

"Fratelli Tutti" tells us to appreciate we're all part of one another.

The Holy Spirit is the engine of history, the wellspring of liberation, healing and reconciliation that Jesus initiated, then entrusted to his followers.

The Spirit calls us to action on real issues.






