

Dear Ascension and St. Edmund Faith Community,

As many of you know, I moved to Oak Park in the summer of 2020 and served as the Associate Pastor at Ascension Parish, while celebrating Mass at St. Giles on some weekends while Fr. Carl Morello became the Administrator at Ascension Parish. After the *Renew My Church* Oak Park unification process was completed, and at the strong encouragement of Bishop Birmingham, I accepted the appointment of becoming the Pastor of the newly united Ascension and St. Edmund Parish on July 1, 2022. Since this time, I have found my pastoral ministry at Ascension and St. Edmund to be to be very fulfilling, meaningful and lifegiving.

As a first-time pastor, coupled with the unique and expected challenges of having two worship sites, I have found my pastoral ministry at Ascension and St. Edmund faith community, combined with the administrative tasks and the added *Renew My Church* expectations to be more demanding than I anticipated. These added responsibilities have not afforded me the proper attention needed to focus on the important sacramental and pastoral needs of Ascension and St. Edmund faith community. As such, after much prayer and reflection, I have asked Cardinal Cupich and Bishop Birmingham to relieve me of my duties as Pastor of Ascension and St. Edmund Parish, beginning on July 1, 2023. This decision will allow me to better focus on the important and necessary pastoral ministry and pastoral care, which has always been a privilege for me.

Due to this change in the administrative structure of Ascension and St. Edmund Parish, Cardinal Cupich, with the support of Bishop Birmingham, has asked Fr. Carl Morello, a respected and experienced Pastor whom the parish knows well, to assume the role of Pastor. I have asked to assist Fr. Carl and continue to live at the Ascension campus and serve at Ascension and St. Edmund Parish in the pastoral care of this wonderful parish, and the Cardinal has granted this request. As you are aware, Fr. Carl Morello and I have already worked well together as a team these past three years, and after much conversation, I feel this would be an easy transition in advancing the vision of creating new structures that support the future of the Oak Park Catholic Community and its wider members.

With these changes, together we will also continue our vision in the development of strong lay leadership which has defined the Oak Park Catholic community for many years. Know, too, that I look forward to continuing in my role of accompanying all of you in our journey of faith. Christ, our Good Shepherd, will always be our community's strength in these moments of transition and in building a new reality for ourselves and for our future generations. Know of my continued prayers for all of you, as I also ask that you pray for me.



Intercultural Immigrant Ministry Update: June 18. 2023

The Catholic Parishes of Oak Park (C-POP) which includes five worship sites: St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy, St. Giles, Family Mass Community, Ascension, and St. Edmund are waiting on a response to their application for funding to support a second migrant family.

Our first family, the Romero-Mora family, is doing really well and is moving quickly to independence. They are hoping to be in their own apartment before school starts so that their youngest will be in a permanent school system. It is likely that they will move to an area with other Venezuelan families farther north. We will miss having them close by.

We have also been accompanying some young women who were living at Bethany House in Hyde Park and are now living independently. Recently, we made a trip to the Economy Shop buying clothes for adults and a little girl.

Newly Formed Parish Finance Committee

The Parish Finance Committee assists the pastor in the administration of parish temporal matters. An active, well-formed finance committee is, therefore, a key element for promoting the financial health of the parish and supporting its mission.

Canon 537 introduces the Finance Committee as a mandated body having an advisory and consultative role with the pastor. It states:

"Each parish is to have a finance committee which is regulated by universal law as well as by norms issued by the diocesan bishop; in this council the Christian faithful, selected according to the same norms, aid the pastor in the administration of parish goods with due regard for the prescription of Canon 532."

Every parish, therefore, is required to have a Finance Committee, both by adherence to the Code of Canon Law and by local norms issued by the diocesan bishop. To be effective, the Finance Committee should meet regularly with specific agendas and should have access to all relevant financial information and policies of the parish. These guidelines are designed to aid pastors and Finance Committee members in the effective functioning of the committee by supporting the pastor in his stewardship of parish resources while being accountable to the parish and diocesan bishop.

Fr. Carl formed a new parish Finance Committee which has now met two times. The first meeting consisted of introductions and discussion of the work of the Finance Committee. Most of the members have served on parish finance committees in years past. Two weeks ago, they met for a second time and the discussion focused on the combined parish budget of St. Catherine-St. Lucy & St. Giles along with the budget for St. Giles School. St. Catherine-St. Lucy School is operated by the Big Shoulders Fund, although Big Shoulders does not cover the total costs of school expenses. More information about the parish costs relative to the school will be forthcoming.

- Overnight Attendant (10:00 pm-5:00 am)

 Volunteers serve a light breakfast, help shelter guests exit and assist with light clean-up.

Food For Thought Without Cost

"The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; Without cost you are to give." (Matthew 10:8)

It was under the bronze canopy of Bernini in St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican that Pope Paul VI closed Vatican II. It was the ninth of December, 1965, sixty-eight years ago.

Results from Vatican II oozed theology, meant to bury the Church of the Middle Ages.
But the final results disappointed:
Failing to bring the Church into the modern world, in the model of Jesus.

Whatever changes that the people had wanted from Vatican II were essentially formless, silent and just lost in the busy Church, frozen in a medieval mind—400 years with no council of reform.

Why did nothing change despite change being expected?
Bishops from around the world supported the vote
on the documents, which lay yet in Rome,
drying in wet ink there and causing no stir here.
Bishops largely ignored them.

A few churches redesigned their confessionals, and a few more removed their precious altar rails.

Add to those the move to vernacular in all liturgical events; not too much happened.

Changes were window dressing.

No talk of reunion with the Christian family, for instance, and no one moved to include women within full leadership positions.

Few lay ministers were deployed in ministry within the churches themselves.

Our synodality this time is different:
Pope Francis has the faithful themselves, with women,
as a part of the agenda-making.
The laity, including women, is involved
in the Church theology.

Laity will say what topics must be discussed—married priests, equality, women ministers, and lots more... they will be allowed to speak.

All around the world, the faithful have gatherings to identify issues.

The male Church in large part stayed male, despite women being allowed as readers and altar servers.

The Church prayers and pronouns continued to be male; invisible women left the Church.

Why had so little changed?

Bishops around the world who voted top support the documents came home and promptly ignored them. Popes John and Paul, who led the way, both died. Both lived on in the hearts of people in the pews.

But Synodality differs.

We must listen to each other in all parts of the world, for a scripture-based following of Jesus.

We must listen to the human cry for support.




