

Last Thursday, I was happy to attend an afternoon conversation with Fr. Greg Boyle SJ, Rev. Marshall Hatch, Jr. (from the MAAFA Redemption Project in West Garfield Park), and Patricia Banks (Director of Sister House, the residential treatment center located on the St. Catherine-St. Lucy campus), which was organized by Jack Crowe.

The theme focused on the power of forgiveness and love that transforms hearts and lives.

Maguire Hall (the gym) on the St. Catherine-St. Lucy campus was filled with 300 folks. At the end of the talk, Fr. Boyle reminded all of us that we are called to be the tender glance of God's love and mercy.



Our faith communities are doing this in some very specific ways right now with our Housing Forward shelter, our shower program for migrants and helping other migrants with apartments as they settle into a new way of life.

As we go through the next phase of Building a New Reality, BNR, let's remember to be that glance of God's love and mercy in how we treat each other. We are all in this together.

Using encouraging words and keeping a positive attitude can help us set a tone that moves us in the best direction to create a new and stronger Catholic community.

We were left with a call, what can we do differently? Good question as we face the challenges and opportunities before us.

Catholic Parishes of Oak Park Migrant Ministry

Thank you so much for your willingness to provide lunches for the migrants at the District 15 Police Station. We have enough volunteers or donations to cover all the Fridays in July and August and many other days as well.

By way of background: Chicago has received over 11,000 new arrivals, 32 buses arrived between June 14 and July 9, 2023. On June 27, there were 4,988 residents in 12 shelters and more than 650 awaiting placement and sleeping on the floor at police stations.

This week, we will meet the new family we will be hosting. They have been vetted by Catholic Charities who will be handling case management. We need members for the team hosting this family. **Would you be interested in accompanying a migrant family?**

We continue to welcome migrants to the St Catherine-St Lucy Rectory on Tuesdays and Thursdays for showers. We have great need for socks and new underwear for women, men, and children.

Here are the recommended sizes:

Men:

- Small and Medium boxer briefs, patterned or colored
- Small and Medium sleeveless and/or shortsleeved T-shirt's, grey or black colors
- Small ankle or crew socks, grey, black, or white Women:
- Small or Medium underwear (most of the women are young)
- Small or Medium sports bras
- Small ankle or crew socks, any color Boys or Girls:
- Small, Medium, and Large underpants.
- Small, Medium, and Large boys' socks

Food For Thought Source of Justice and Love

"You, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in kindness and fidelity. Turn toward me, and have pity on me; Give your strength to your servant." (Psalm 86: 15-16)

From the Book of Wisdom, with Solomon considered its likely author:

"There is no God besides you, who have care for all."

How different might the world be, if that were our credo—the one thing we all really believe. It goes on: Divine power generating justice; Justice begetting kindness; Strength engendering leniency; Children given good ground for hope.

In theologian James Alison's
"Jesus the Forgiving Victim,"
he suggests a summary of Jesus' message,
posing that we all find it difficult
to believe God loves us...tend to be frightened...
inclined to run from death, engaging
in self-delusion and self-destruction.
We ask if things will really be well;
Are we held in being by someone
who is utterly trustworthy?

Today's readings could be viewed as an invitation to a renewed sense of God and ourselves. Having heard In Wisdom of God's immensity as a source of loving kindness, we turn to Paul's teaching about prayer. Despite our celebrating liturgies and singing our hearts out, Paul puts us down when he says we don't know how to pray! We do tend to look toward God on our terms.

So, is there a better, truer way to view God?
Well, Paul reminds us the Spirit intercedes
for us with "inexpressible grownings."
Really? That's what prayer is all about?
He used that word last week
when he talked about all creation
longing to come into fulfillment.
Ignatius would say we connect
with our deepest desires with the Spirit's help,
leading us to union with God.

It takes a good groan to reach that depth, and be in touch with the longings at the heart of our very being.

Jesus' words in the gospel come as comforting assurance, when we're told not to worry about failures—that his dynamic reign can't be stopped.

The Spirit within us promises that there is more coming than we can ever imagine.

God draws us into an ever-expanding future; we will reflect more and more of the God who loves us into growth. He will do the work, not for us, but with and within us.

Beware!!!

Risk of Cyber Attacks and Email Scams are Constant! It is estimated that over 3 billion phishing emails are sent each day!

Always be mindful of suspicious emails and make sure they are from a legitimate source.

They could be from a criminal attempting to:

- 1. Impersonate a Co-worker
- 2. Impersonate a Vendor
- 3. Impersonate a Customer
- 4. Impersonate a Government Agency
- 5. Impersonate anyone else that you may trust

What do these scams look like and how can you protect yourself?

Criminals impersonate a trusted contact by email, phone, text, or mail and may eventually:

- Request your passwords
- Request you to redirect payments to a new account, or request that you purchase gift cards for an "urgent need"
- Request you click on a link
- Request you download or open a file
- Or, provide other information that can be used against you

<u>Criminals create email addresses that may look very similar to legitimate email addresses, often only different by one letter or character.</u> They may even use part of a legitimate email conversation in their email trail to give the appearances that the email is legitimate.

Some of the ways you can protect yourself include:

Verify the Sending Email Address: Always double-check the email address of the sender before responding, opening a link or document, or sharing any sensitive information. Phishing emails often use deceptive tactics to make their email addresses appear similar to legitimate ones. Pay close attention to any misspellings, unfamiliar domains, or slight variations in email addresses.

Be Wary of Urgent Requests or Unsolicited Attachments/

<u>Links:</u> Exercise caution when encountering emails that demand immediate action or contain unexpected attachments or links. Phishing attempts often rely on urgency or curiosity to entice recipients into taking action without proper consideration.

<u>Hover Over Links:</u> Before clicking on any hyperlink in an email, hover your mouse cursor over the link to reveal the actual destination URL. Verify if it matches the expected website or domain. If the link appears suspicious or unfamiliar, refrain from clicking on it.

<u>Practice Good Cyber Hygiene:</u> Regularly update your devices' operating systems, applications, and antivirus software to ensure you have the latest security patches and protections. Additionally, use unique, strong passwords for all your online accounts, enable multi-factor authentication whenever possible, and avoid reusing passwords across different platforms.

- Basement sanitized and cleaned after the flood

- Replacement sump pumps ordered. Insurance will cover the cost of the new industrial sump pumps

Church

- Roofing contract signed to repair all level elevation roofs: sacristy, chapel, music room, former baptistery. Work to be scheduled asap
- Repair work on all down spouts, gutters, and scuppers included in roofing contract
- Replacement sump pumps ordered. Insurance will cover the cost of the new industrial sump pumps

Parking Lots

- Repaying the parking lot between Maguire Hall and Rectory is scheduled for Thursday, August 3 through Friday, August 4
 - Repaving the asphalt area between Sister House, School, and Church
 - Repair and patch the Chicago parking lot on Austin and Washington
 - Additional handicapped spaces will be added to the parking lot when it is stripped

St. Giles Campus Facility Updates July 2023

There are about 8 weeks in the summer to tackle campus projects. The following projects are in process or have been completed.

Frawley Building, 1034 Linden

- ♦ Replacement of a vacuum condensate pumps for the boilers
- ♦ Painting- boys bathroom, east hallway and two classrooms
- ♦ Plumbing
 - Install a back flow valve system as required by code
 - Repipe all hot and cold-water feeds in the basement which were original from 1928
 - Install individual shut off valves for the Church, Rectory and Frawley Buildings

Corrigan Building, 1030 Linden

- Repaired and installed new and more secure door hardware for wooden doors
- Repaired and replastered the Linden entrance
- ♦ Painted 4 classrooms
- Rehabbed the band room behind the stage- painted and repaired walls and floors
- Rehabbed the rest rooms in the band room with new commode, sinks and dispensary
- ♦ Playground asphalt ground and new asphalt laid funded by a grant
- Playground installation of rubber cycle soft surface material over the rubber mulch
- ♦ Catch basins cleaned and 300 gallons of rubber mulch removed from basin

Gleeson Building, 1101 Columbian

- ♦ Installation of drain tile and pumps in the basement to eliminate flood and mold
- ♦ New fencing for the playground will be installed in early August
- Possible soft surface rubber cycle material to be added to the playlot

Main Parking Lot


- \Diamond $\;$ Tree trimming and weed removal along the alley
- Old fencing removed and new fencing to be installed – funded by the PTO
- ♦ Benches to be added to the area

Rectory

- Replacement of 15 windows which have been ordered and will be installed before the fall
- Replacement of cold-water feed line from the basement of the Rectory into the basement of the Church
- \Diamond Repairs to the masonry wall behind the Rectory

Campus Projects

- Replacement of the phone system for the entire campus (The current system is Toshiba which is no longer in the phone business)
- Installation of cloud-based phone system which will begin the week of August 7
- Replacement and installation of new server for the Parish offices and Rectory

- Meal Provider (To be delivered at 7:00 pm)
 Volunteers donate and deliver a hot dinner meal, and/or a continental breakfast and/or a sack to-go lunches for 15 people.


