Fr. Carl's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

More than ever, as we enter this next phase of *Building A New Reality*, we have an opportunity to recall this fact. As followers of Jesus, we're each called to take our place in the Kingdom of God and help build it up. This is exactly what we are trying to do in creative and new ways with our united Religious Education Program, the *Spirit and Light* collaborative, and also with the Feasibility Study that has been taking place the past year in how best to repurpose the Rectory on the St. Catherine-St. Lucy campus. We are creating some new initiatives that may interest and encourage others to participate as Church in new and attractive ways.

As we hear more about these opportunities, consider these suggestions to do your part.

Find your gifts: What special gifts do you possess? In addition to talents and skills, these can include wisdom from life experience or a particularly deep faith. Discern your gifts and ask God where he wants you to use them.

Cultivate gratitude: Write down everything for which you are grateful in a "Blessing List." Review it and add to it regularly, especially when tempted to gossip about others, when tempted to jealousy or discouragement and anger because of changes you don't agree with.

Practice humility: St Thomas Aquinas said, "Humility means seeing ourselves as God sees us: knowing every good we have comes from Him as pure gift. Let others have the best place, the last word. Imitate him who is "gentle of heart."

Be ready to serve: Any act of service can build up our parish, neighborhood and community. Small or great, everyone can contribute something. Give of yourself.

Strive for the higher gifts: Jesus asked every one of us to love God and each other. Without love, St. Paul said, "I gain nothing."

As we step into year two of *Building A New Reality* in our parishes and community as church, we can be sure we are on the right path if we walk in humility, service and charity while truly striving to love God by caring for and loving each other.

A good question to ponder for us, as individuals and as community, might be: *What new things might Jesus be inviting me toward in my life and as a member of this faith community?*

Having requested more immediate help and support from the Facilities and Building Department of the Archdiocese, Murphy Hall on the St. Edmund campus is once again open for the community to use. The church remains closed at this time. However, reports are soon due on the work to be done and the bidding process to hire the company to handle the repairs. Soon we will have a better idea when the process can begin and a timeline for re-opening the Church. In the meantime, continued patience is needed. I have been asked about removing the fencing surrounding the front of the building. This is a safety and liability concern, and the fence cannot be taken down at this time. I realize this has been a process... and it continues.

Catholic Parishes of Oak Park Migrant Ministry

Thank you so much for your willingness to provide lunches for the migrants at the District 15 Police Station. We have enough volunteers or donations to cover all the Fridays in July and August and many other days as well.

By way of background: Chicago has received over 11,000 new arrivals, 32 buses arrived between June 14 and July 9. On June 27, there were 4,988 residents in 12 shelters and more than 650 awaiting placement and sleeping on the floor at police stations.

This week, we will meet the new family we will be hosting. They have been vetted by Catholic Charities who will be handling case management. We need members for the team hosting this family. **Would you be interested in accompanying a migrant family?**

We continue to welcome migrants to the St Catherine-St Lucy Rectory on Tuesdays and Thursdays for showers. We have great need for socks and new underwear for women, men, and children. Here are the recommended sizes:

Men:

- Small and Medium boxer briefs, patterned or colored
- Small and Medium sleeveless and/or short-sleeved T-shirt's, grey or black colors
- Small ankle or crew socks, grey, black, or white

Women:

- Small or Medium underwear (most of the women are young)
- Small or Medium sports bras
- Small ankle or crew socks, any color

Boys or Girls:

- Small, Medium, and Large underpants.
- Small, Medium, and Large boys' socks

If you would like to bring any of these items with you to Mass, we will have baskets placed in the gathering space of each church for you to place your donations.

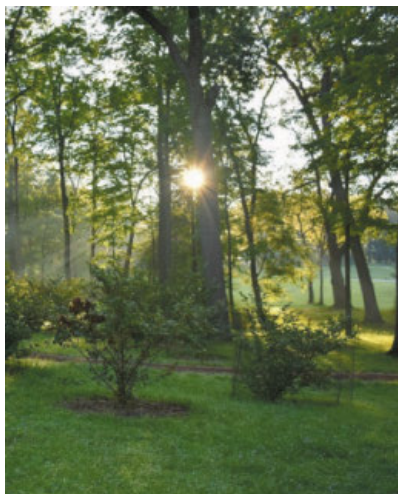

Theology on the Green **Visiting the Imprisoned: Kolbe House Jail Ministry**

Speaker: Emily Cortina

St. Giles Courtyard

Visiting the imprisoned is one of the corporal works of mercy that gives us the most trouble, yet "the challenge of curbing crime and reshaping the criminal justice system is not just a matter of public policy but is also a test of Catholic commitment" (USCCB). Join us for this session to learn more about what "justice" looks like in today's legal system, explore how our Catholic faith challenges us to imagine justice differently, and consider ways that each of us can respond to the call to meet Jesus in our brothers and sisters in prison.

Kolbe House is the jail ministry of the Archdiocese of Chicago, providing ministry to individuals in Cook County Jail and in prisons across Illinois, as well as to men and women recently released from incarceration and to families. Responding to the Gospel mandate, "I was in prison and you visited me," Kolbe House seeks to foster hope, healing and faith in God's merciful love to all who are affected by incarceration.

Emily Cortina is the Coordinator of Outreach and Formation at Kolbe House. Her vocation turned towards justice ministry when she met her husband, who had received visits from a Kolbe House chaplain while incarcerated. Through relationships with youth in detention, women and men in jail and prison, and families with loved ones incarcerated, Emily has become convinced of God's unconditional love for each of us and of the transformative power that the Catholic Church can have in building a world marked by justice. She and her husband have three young children and live in Chicago's Lower West Side.

Spiritual Classics In-Person Discussion on Cardinal Bernardin's *The Gift of Peace*

Starting in September, Spiritual Classics will be meeting in-person once a month at the Ascension campus in the Parish Center.

The Gift of Peace by Cardinal Joseph Bernardin, a former Archbishop of Chicago, will kick off Spiritual Classics for the 2023-2024 year, on **Tuesday, September 5, 2023 at 7:30 pm in the Ascension Parish Center Dining Room.** The discussion will be led by Jeff Wood. All from the Oak Park parishes are welcome.

In the last two months of his life, Cardinal Bernardin made it his mission to share his personal reflections and insights on a string of traumatic events in his life, including his battle with pancreatic cancer, a false accusation of sexual abuse, reconciliation with his accuser, and his decision to discontinue chemotherapy and live his remaining days as fully as possible. Bernardin tells his story openly and honestly, and shares the profound peace he viewed as a gift from God.

Oak Park Catholic Religious Education

We are excited to announce an update to all the Religious Education programs in the Oak Park area! Historically there were separate Religious Education offerings in each of the four Oak Park Catholic Churches as well as the Family Mass Community. Over the past few years, there has already been some collaboration between those Religious Education departments. This year, that collaboration will be even stronger.

With a unified Religious Education, families will be able to discern which Religious Education model works best for them, empowering parents to truly be the first teachers of their children. Religious Education will be more responsive to unique situations. Some classes have a Montessori style learning environment with experiential opportunities. Others have a more traditional classroom and use a text book. One has families coming together to share prayer and engage faith.

Catholic families across Oak Park and surrounding areas will be able to get to know one another better, creating a broader community and stronger sense of identity.

Sacramental preparation for First Communion, First Reconciliation, and Confirmation are a part of this collaboration. While most children will receive sacraments at their home parish, with a unified preparation program, families can now select the day and time of the classes that work best for them.

This unified Religious Education is a part of *Spirit and Light: A Catholic Collaborative for Living Faith*. It is a catechetical resource for the Catholic Community in Oak Park and the surrounding areas. Its mission is welcoming all and sharing Christian faith within the Catholic context.

Here is a listing of our 2023-24 program offerings.

PREP (Preschool Religious Education Program) is designed to give pre-school children (ages 3-5 years - PK3, PK4 and K) an introduction to basic Catholic Christian Principles.

PREP (PK3, PK4 and K) at St. Giles Campus in the Gleeson Building, Rooms A & B
Classes offered on Sunday during Mass at 10:30 am

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD (CGS) is a faith formation program based on the Bible, the Liturgy of our Church, and the educational principles of Maria Montessori. Children and Catechists gather to further experience their relationship with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and their life in the church. The CGS program has three multi-age levels for children in grades Pre-K through 6th.

CGS - LEVEL I - 3 to 6 Years Old (PK3, PK4 and K)

CGS - LEVEL II - 6 to 9 Years Old (Grades 1, 2 and 3)

CGS - LEVEL III - 9 to 12 Years Old (Grades 4, 5 and 6)

At Ascension Campus in the Parish Center; and at St. Giles in the Dore Parish Center (Level I and Level II) and the Gleeson Building (Level III).

Classes offered at various times on Sunday mornings, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday afternoons and evenings, and Saturday mornings. See upcoming registration for more details.

FAMILY RELIGIOUS EDUCATION is an opportunity for the entire family, parents and children in Grades 1-6, to grow in faith. The child along with parents attend a monthly meeting where there is time for family conversation as well as age-appropriate activities. The remainder of the month, students work with parents at home using a text book.

Family RE - Catechesis (Grades 1-6) at St. Giles Campus in McDonough Hall
Monthly Meetings on Sundays from 9:00 to 10:15 am

TRADITIONAL RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (TRE) is a text-based faith formation program for Grades 1 – 8. The program is designed for students to learn about our Catholic faith, teachings, and traditions.

TRE (Grades 1-8) at Ascension Campus in the School Building
Classes offered on Sundays (9:00-10:15 am) or Tuesdays (6:45-8:00 pm)

MIDDLE SCHOOL MINISTRY is a religious education opportunity for 7th and 8th Grade students. Learning occurs primarily through discussion and activities at tables with a table leader. Students meet in person twice a month and have an at-home activity once a month.

Middle School Ministry (Grades 7-8) at St. Giles Campus in McDonough Hall
Meet twice a month on Wednesdays (4:30-5:45 pm **or** 7:00-8:15 pm) with a monthly at-home activity

SPRED (Special Religious Development) is a program of the Archdiocese of Chicago whose purpose is two-fold: the inclusion of the developmentally disabled into the liturgical and community faith life of the parish and the formation of a small faith community where both special friends and their catechists nurture their faith. Ages 6-10 years old.

SPRED at St. Giles Campus

Classes are offered twice a month on Wednesdays from 6:00-7:15 pm

Registration for SPRED will not be online - Contact the Spirit and Light RE Office for more information and registration.

Sacramental Preparation is a parish-wide endeavor, with children from the Religious Education programs and our parish schools coming together to prepare for these most important steps in their faith journey. The First Communion, Reconciliation, and Confirmation preparation sessions are in addition to the Religious Education classes and school religion curriculum. Preparation sessions will be available at Ascension and St. Giles churches. The children will ordinarily receive sacraments at their home parish, but with a unified preparation program, families can choose which site, day and time for preparation sessions will work best for them.

Spirit and Light is a team of people: coordinators of various programs who are responsible for their specific areas yet support one another. The entire team is here for the children, families and all parishioners. Please feel free to contact them.

Commonly Asked Questions

Q: Where will the classes be held?

A: Family RE, Middle School Ministry, and PREP will be on the St. Giles campus. Traditional Religious Education will be on the Ascension campus. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd will be on both the Ascension and the St. Giles campuses. Additionally, preparation for First Communion, Reconciliation, and Confirmation will be held on both the Ascension and St. Giles campuses.

Q: If I am a member of Ascension and St. Edmund Parish, can my child attend Religious Education on the St. Giles campus?

A: Yes. Any child can attend any Religious Education offering.

Q: If I am a member of St. Catherine of Siena-St. Lucy and St. Giles parish, can my child participate in sacramental preparation on the Ascension campus?

A: Yes. Families can choose the sacramental preparation that is best for their child and the family schedule.

Q: How do I best choose a Religious Education class for my child?

A: There are a number of considerations. How does my child best learn? How much structure does my child need? How involved do I, as a parent, want to be? What day and time allow for consistent participation? To help sort this out or find out more information about a particular program, contact the appropriate person on the *Spirit and Light* team.

Q: Does this unification of Religious Education change my current status as a parishioner at a particular parish?

A: No. Where a person is a parishioner is not impacted by this unification.

Q: How is this paid for?

A: The Religious Education tuition covers some of the costs. As a vital ministry in the Catholic Church, Religious Education will be supported by both parishes. As in years past, there will be opportunities for families to help defray the program costs via small fundraising projects in the upcoming year.

Q: Is there a benefit to volunteering in the Religious Education program?

A: Yes! Adults have the joy of sharing their faith and witnessing the students grow in theirs. Volunteers in our programs are participating in creating the Church of the future. Additionally, catechists, assistants, table leaders, and mentors in the programs get 50% off their child's Religious Education tuition.

Q: Is *Spirit and Light: A Catholic Collaborative for Living Faith* just Religious Education?

A: No. The unified Religious Education is a part of *Spirit and Light*, but the collaborative also includes adult faith formation, evangelization, and other opportunities. An example is Faith and Fellowship, which is adult catechesis for those with severe mental illness.

St. Edmund Church Construction Update

Dear Parishioners,

This is a weekly update on the construction progress at St. Edmund Church from Fr. Carl Morello and Deacon Gerald Keenan, Chief of Parish and School Operations.

- Many of you have asked for the names of the advisory committee comprised of various parishioners. They include Tim Blatner (Ascension, legacy parish), Susan Viselli (St. Edmund, legacy parish) and Tom Wheeler (St. Edmund, legacy parish). The names had not been published as we were waiting for our first official meeting to take place. That meeting came in the form of a walk-through of the church and Murphy Hall which took place last week. Susan Viselli, longtime parishioner and parish leader, has provided a summary of the committee's observations from our walk-through in a letter to parishioners of Ascension and St. Edmund which is in this week's bulletin.
- We are happy to announce that Murphy Hall, one of the fully accessible spaces on the St. Edmund campus, will reopen on Saturday, July 29! The reopening will kick off with a fun hospitality event following Ascension's Saturday Mass. Fr. Carl will be on hand to welcome everyone. This is an opportunity to come together as a unified faith community, mingle with our pastor and enjoy this much used space. The invitation can be found in this weekend's bulletin. We are grateful to Fr. Carl for prioritizing the reopening of the social hall. In this way, we can continue our important work in a space where every member of our community can partake in our parish offerings with no worry about accessibility.
- Once the assessment report for the construction work is made available, we plan to schedule several gathering opportunities where we can share and discuss the information with all of you.

God came to Solomon in a dream, and promised to give Solomon whatever he might want. Solomon replied: "...Give your servant an understanding heart to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong. For who is able to govern this vast people of yours?" The Lord was pleased that Solomon made this request... "Because you have asked for this—for understanding so that you may know what is right—I do as you requested. I give you a heart so wise and understanding that there has never been anyone like you up to now, and after you there will come no one to equal you." (1 Kings 3:7-12)

The seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit have stood the test of time, being unchanged from what was taught us in grammar school:
Wisdom, understanding,
counsel and fortitude,
knowledge and piety,
and also fear of the Lord.
To those we well might add
prudence and compassion,
justice, sobriety;
All taught with words or maybe the sword.

The Spirit likely rode with *Joanne d'Arc*;
Inspired St. Catherine of Siena;
Helped to raise the flag on Iwo Jima;
Led our Founding Fathers to light from dark.
Isaiah, the first to write of the Gifts,
names Justice as the Spirit's prime schema.

Wisdom, as written in its Bible book,
goes about seeking those worthy of her,
and shows herself to them quite cheerfully.
Refreshing as a cool summer brook,
Wisdom is more beautiful than the sun,
and above all the order of the stars.

Wisdom is reflected in the faces
of the wise, as says the book of Proverbs,

At Baptism and Confirmation,
the importance of the Holy Spirit
as an Advocate makes us more attuned
to God's voice, as our body's a station

Today's readings offer some lessons:
Wisdom is a divine gift already given
that can be deepened. It is a virtue
necessary to control aggressions
and show smart leadership. Rudderless ships
of state cannot sail wisely or with purpose,
and must be transformed or dismantled.

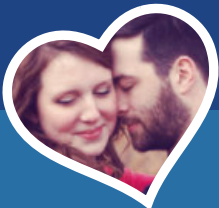
