### Fr. Carl's Corner



Dear Faith Community,

Last weekend's Gospel had a message that bears repeating as we navigate the changes of Renew My Church and now Building a New Reality (BNR). We have been given a treasure, our faith in Jesus Christ! Jesus' gift of his body, broken and shared for us all, is the treasure we seek. Jesus is ultimately the reason why our communities exist. To support each other in growing and living our faith as well as bringing others to come to know Jesus is at the heart of BNR and the reason for coming together in ways that support our mission.

The mantra I have heard over these last years as I have been attending meetings preparing for the process we are entering into is, MISSION over MAINTENANCE!

I think this is important for us all to remember and pray about as we work together to face the challenges and opportunities that are set before us.

I have said this more than once, I truly believe that the same Holy Spirit that moved the disciples at the first Pentecost is also with us now guiding us. I also recognize in this new structure that I am blessed to have Fr. Rex, Fr. Carlton, Fr. Bob and Fr. Lucas (Ascension and St. Edmund), and Frs. Tom and Ed (St. Catherine-St. Lucy and St. Giles), and our deacons, to continue the important work of pastoral care in the community. Likewise, we already have strong lay leadership that we can build upon as we walk this journey together.

There are some very constructive suggestions that have been presented to me that I, with our pastoral team, will do my best to address. Some of the concerns I've heard are "being present at important events; working on listening and healing hurts, real or perceived; transparency in communications; getting our parish councils started; having two new parishes that still have four building sites and how we will care for them."

Along with these concerns was also the recognition of the wonderful opportunity to take the gifts offered by different lay leadership and empower more of the same.

Three things I have come to realize as we begin the journey, which I'd ask you to keep in mind:

First, we will set priorities and take this all one step at a time. (Staff, Finance Councils and Parish Councils will be a guide along the way.) Secondly, I know that at the end of every day, there will always be

unfinished business. (I, we, can't be too hard on ourselves! No matter how hard we work, this is just the reality.)

Finally, this is a different structure for being a pastor. There will not be enough of me to go around in the ways I, and parishioners, are accustomed to having a "Pastor." That's where our "team" - our priests, deacons, and lay leaders come in as representatives of the Pastor and will share the responsibility to guide and grow our community.

I realize there are concerns, questions and uncertainty all mixed in with some excitement about what we can do as we build a new reality, being church together for all the members of the Oak Park Community and all our members beyond. As we share Eucharist, let us ask God for an understanding heart to distinguish, in our words and actions, what tears down and what will help build up who we are as followers of Jesus Christ and who we will become.

With you a Christian. For you a Priest. Have a joyful week ahead.

#### St. Giles Pipe Organ Project Update

The Pipe Organ Project is well under way. Berghaus Organ Company worked for four weeks on the removal of the pipes from the north side church that is being demolished for housing. Each pipe had to be individually categorized and boxed to be taken to their warehouse in Bellwood.

At the same time, Berghaus did a pipe-by-pipe inspection of the remaining pipes of the St. Giles organ. There are two areas in St. Giles Church where the pipes are currently located: on the south side above the baptistery and on the north side in two rooms above and behind the St. Joseph altar.



The next steps in the process are cleaning, repairing and refurbishing the pipes from the north side church as well as

the pipes that are salvageable from the St. Giles pipe organ. The pipes from St. Giles will need to be boxed and sent to the shop in Bellwood for repair. The non-salvageable equipment at St. Giles, like the blower, duct work and casement for the organ pipes will have to be dismantled.

The total cost for the project is \$727,188. We are blessed that one family stepped up with a donation of \$50,000 for the pipe organ refurbishment project.

# Theology on the Green Welcoming the Stranger: Immigration

The Corporal Work of Mercy, Sheltering the Homeless, is attending to people who

are unhoused, but this imperative is also for people who have migrated, fleeing from violence, war and famine.

This Theology on the Green will include an overview of the need in the area of immigration in Chicago, focusing on the humanitarian needs of the migrant. There will be discussion of how Oak Park Catholic Parishes' migrant ministry has developed as well as where we are right now and what the hopes are for the future. Additionally, Margie and Celine will share their own stories of how they got involved in migrant ministry.

Margie Rudnik worked until retirement in home health and hospice, is a co-founder of Companions Journeying Together, and is now a Mercy Associate. After retirement she began to volunteer for ICDI now Illinois Community for Displaced Immigrants. In 2022, Margie made an immersion trip to the El Paso/Juarez border and observed the massive amount of volunteer work being done by the people and churches in those cities. Earlier in 2022 volunteers from Ascension invited her to join



them in meeting with people from St. Leonard to look toward ways to accompany the migrants as a joint Oak Park effort.




Celine Woznica and her husband, Don, have been members of Ascension-St. Edmund since 1992 when they moved back to Oak Park after serving for 11 years as Maryknoll Lay Missioners in Nicaragua and Oaxaca, Mexico. Since returning to Chicago, Celine has worked with immigrant and refugee populations in the area of community and public health and recently retired from teaching in Northeastern Illinois University's MPH program.

### Food For Thought The Yearning to Breathe

"Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free, the wretched refuse of your teeming shore. Send these, the homeless, tempest-tossed to me. I lift my lamp beside the golden door. (Statue of Liberty, Ellis Island)

There, facing East in New York Harbor, stands the brazen beauty of Lady Liberty, lifting her lamp in warm welcome to all immigrants seeking a better life.

While along the Texas-Mexico border, thousands of miles to the southwest, the Governor of Texas oversees "Operation Lone Star," which should be named "Operation Border Cruelty."

What's happening to our country?

Governor Abbott's escalating political stunts at the border are dangerous and clearly illegal, have been in force for over two years, operating fully separately from all branches of federal government. The Supreme Court of the United States found Abbott's actions in violation of federal law, and our Mexican treaty. Can politics negate laws and treaties?

President Biden has every right and every responsibility to enforce federal government border authority without state interference.

The DOJ has just filed a lawsuit calling on Gov. Abbott to remove the dangerous floating barrier of buoys he installed in the Rio Grande.

Abbott's clear: he refuses to comply.

Do we care he's causing suffering and deaths?

Texas troopers have also installed razor "traps," in addition to the wall of floating buoys, that force asylum seekers Into more dangerous parts of the river.

Last week a medic with the Texas Dept of Public Safety blew the whistle, reporting troopers were ordered "to push small children and nursing babies back into the Rio Grande."

Is this what a "More Perfect Union" does?

The U.S. Border Patrol reports
that Operation Lone Star is preventing
them from processing migrants and providing
humanitarian aid. Last year, a record
890 migrant drownings occurred.
Joe Biden's Victory came with a promise
to restore our country as a safe haven
for migrants. Has Joe discussed
this with the Holy Spirit?

Our Founding Fathers risked their lives to escape tyrannical rule and form a land where people can live and breathe freely. The Holy Spirit had surely gifted them with the Wisdom and Fortitude to do so.

#### Oak Park Catholic Religious Education

We are excited to announce an update to all the Religious Education programs in the Oak Park area! Historically there were separate Religious Education offerings in each of the four Oak Park Catholic Churches as well as the Family Mass Community. Over the past few years, there has already been some collaboration between those Religious Education departments. This year, that collaboration will be even stronger.

With a unified Religious Education, families will be able to discern which Religious Education model works best for them, empowering parents to truly be the first teachers of their children. Religious Education will be more responsive to unique situations. Some classes have a Montessori style learning environment with experiential opportunities. Others have a more traditional classroom and use a text book. One has families coming together to share prayer and engage faith.

Catholic families across Oak Park and surrounding areas will be able to get to know one another better, creating a broader community and stronger sense of identity.

Sacramental preparation for First Communion, First Reconciliation, and Confirmation are a part of this collaboration. While most children will receive sacraments at their home parish, with a unified preparation program, families can now select the day and time of the classes that work best for them.

This unified Religious Education is a part of *Spirit and Light: A Catholic Collaborative for Living Faith*. It is a catechetical resource for the Catholic Community in Oak Park and the surrounding areas. Its mission is welcoming all and sharing Christian faith within the Catholic context.

Here is a listing of our 2023-24 program offerings.

<u>PREP</u> (Preschool Religious Education Program) is designed to give pre-school children (ages 3-5 years - PK3, PK4 and K) an introduction to basic Catholic Christian Principles.

PREP (PK3, PK4 and K) at St. Giles Campus in the Gleeson Building, Rooms A & B Classes offered on Sunday during Mass at 10:30 am

<u>CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD (CGS)</u> is a faith formation program based on the Bible, the Liturgy of our Church, and the educational principles of Maria Montessori. Children and Catechists gather to further experience their relationship with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and their life in the church. The CGS program has three multi-age levels for children in grades Pre-K through 6th.

CGS - LEVEL I - 3 to 6 Years Old (PK3, PK4 and K)

CGS - LEVEL II - 6 to 9 Years Old (Grades 1, 2 and 3)

CGS - LEVEL III - 9 to 12 Years Old (Grades 4, 5 and 6)

At Ascension Campus in the Parish Center; and at St. Giles in the Dore Parish Center (Level I and Level II) and the Gleeson Building (Level III).

Classes offered at various times on Sunday mornings, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday afternoons and evenings, and Saturday mornings. See upcoming registration for more details.

<u>FAMILY RELIGIOUS EDUCATION</u> is an opportunity for the entire family, parents and children in Grades 1-6, to grow in faith. The child along with parents attend a monthly meeting where there is time for family conversation as well as age-appropriate activities. The remainder of the month, students work with parents at home using a text book.

TRADITIONAL RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (TRE) is a text-based faith formation program for Grades 1 – 8.

The program is designed for students to learn about our Catholic faith, teachings, and traditions.

TRE (Grades 1-8) at Ascension Campus in the School Building

Classes offered on Sundays (9:00-10:15 am) or Tuesdays (6:45-8:00 pm)

<u>MIDDLE SCHOOL MINISTRY</u> is a religious education opportunity for 7th and 8th Grade students. Learning occurs primarily through discussion and activities at tables with a table leader. Students meet in person twice a month and have an at-home activity once a month.

Middle School Ministry (Grades 7-8) at St. Giles Campus in McDonough Hall Meet twice a month on Wednesdays (4:30-5:45 pm **or** 7:00-8:15 pm) with a monthly at-home activity

<u>SPRED</u> (Special Religious Development) is a program of the Archdiocese of Chicago whose purpose is two-fold: the inclusion of the developmentally disabled into the liturgical and community faith life of the parish and the formation of a small faith community where both special friends and their catechists nurture their faith. Ages 6-10 years old.

SPRED at St. Giles Campus

Classes are offered twice a month on Wednesdays from 6:00-7:15 pm

**Sacramental Preparation** is a parish-wide endeavor, with children from the Religious Education programs and our parish schools coming together to prepare for these most important steps in their faith journey. The First Communion, Reconciliation, and Confirmation preparation sessions are in addition to the Religious Education classes and school religion curriculum. Preparation sessions will be available at Ascension and St. Giles churches. The children will ordinarily receive sacraments at their home parish, but with a unified preparation program, families can choose which site, day and time for preparation sessions will work best for them.

*Spirit and Light* is a team of people: coordinators of various programs who are responsible for their specific areas yet support one another. The entire team is here for the children, families and all parishioners. Please feel free to contact them.




