Fr. Carl's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

While we are all aware of the storm damage that has kept St. Edmund Church closed since Easter, we may not be aware or realize what an impact the church being closed would have on George's Restaurant just across the street. After Sunday morning and weekday Masses, folks would meet over at Geroge's for conversation and nourishment. The last few times I have been to George's, he has asked me, "Fr. Carl, when will the church be opened again?" The answer - it is a process, and a slow one right now. We are finally at the point

where contractors have been walking through and will bid on the work to be done. I anticipate this work to be completed sometime this fall.

In the meantime, consider stopping in at George's, whose business has been diminished by the unfortunate storm damage to St. Edmund Church. Be sure to say, "Hi Geoge," and tell him, "Fr. Carl sent me!!"

We can all take an important lesson from this situation. Not long ago while I was away visiting a friend, I was preparing for a meeting on Zoom. Suddenly, the electricity went out and remained out for hours. At a time like that, there was not much I could do. Events like that are simply out of our control. As stuck as we may feel, there is also a sense of freedom in the situation. In these instances, we need to remember God has given us free will, the ability to choose, and the power to create. None the less, our freedom is limited. For in the end, it all belongs to the Lord. Accepting what we can and cannot do and acknowledging God's control over it all is not always easy to do. But that is the place, even in the most frustrating of circumstances, we find peace.

Pope Francis reminds us – Faith is not a privilege to be claimed, but a Gift to be shared.

With you a Christian. For you a priest. Have a joyful week ahead.



2023/24 Program Offerings

PREP is designed to give pre-school children (ages 3-5 years - PK3, PK4 and K) an introduction to basic Catholic Christian Principles.

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD (CGS) is a faith formation program based on the Bible, the Liturgy of our Church, and educational principles of Maria Montessori. Children and Catechists gather to further experience their relationship with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and their life in the church. The CGS program has three multi-age levels for children in grades Pre-K through 6th. CGS - LEVEL I - 3 to 6 Years Old (PK3, PK4 and K) CGS - LEVEL II - 6 to 9 Years Old (GRADES 1, 2 and 3) CGS - LEVEL III - 9 to 12 Years Old (GRADES 4, 5 and 6)

Spirit and Light

FAMILY RELIGIOUS EDUCATION is an opportunity for the entire family, parents and children in Grades 1-6, to grow in faith. The child along with parents attend a monthly meeting where there is time for family conversation as well as age-appropriate activities. The remainder of the month, students work with parents at home using a text book.

TRADITIONAL RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (TRE) is a text-based faith formation program for 1st – 8th grades. The program is designed for students to learn about our Catholic faith, teachings, and traditions.

MIDDLE SCHOOL MINISTRY is a religious education opportunity for 7th and 8th grade students. Learning occurs primarily through discussion and activities at tables with a table leader. Students meet in person twice a month and have an at-home activity once a month.

SPRED (Special Religious Development) is a program of the Archdiocese of Chicago whose purpose is two-fold: the inclusion of the developmentally disabled into the liturgical and community faith life of the parish and the formation of a small faith community where both special friends and their catechists nurture their faith. Ages 6-10 years old.



UPDATES ON CATHOLIC PARISHES OF OAK PARK MIGRANT MINISTRY

Thank you to everyone who responded to last week's notice about the Catholic Parishes of Oak Park's outreach to the asylum-seeking migrants sleeping on the floor of the Chicago Police Station at 5700 W. Madison. The situation is difficult, but we can make life a bit easier with donations of food, clothing, shoes, blankets, sheets, pillows, and small hotel-size toiletries. Suitcases of all sizes are welcome so migrants can keep their belongings together. Donated items need not be new and can be left on the Woznica front porch, 711 S. Elmwood Ave.

We have met both families that we hope to resettle. Escarlet and Yoel and their beautiful 18 month old daughter arrived in Chicago in March, and have been living in an under-resourced shelter in South Chicago. The conditions are not good and they are anxious to move out. The second family, Jessica and Carlos, have three children. They have been living in unstable housing in Melrose Park, including sleeping in a car. They were recommended to us by the Scalabrini Immigrant and Refugee Services.



We welcome assistance in finding them housing, including contacts with realtors in the area or available low-cost apartments. Catholic Charities will be assisting us with housing costs for both families for at least six months.

Food For Thought A Mission for Light

O God, let all the nations praise you! You are just, you are welcome, you are love. Let us never deny your gifts to others, all created in your image and likeness, seeking relationship with you and your holy people. You are unity and healing for all nations. Amen. (Living Liturgy, p. 163)

The Catholic Church's brightest lights shine with humanity and compassion for the marginalized, the needy and the poor, in places like the barrios of Latin America, the crowded streets of India, and now at Polish border points and all across the country, where Ukrainians fleeing the horrors of war have found safe refuge in the homes and hearts of their Polish neighbors.

The invasion began 18 months ago; the U.N. reports over 13 million Ukrainians have crossed the border into Poland. Despite the history of enmity, and the scope of the rescue, the atmosphere is warm and friendly. Attitudes have changed. A Catholic spiritual army of clerics, religious and laity, is using a network of churches, convents, monasteries and parish homes, to host desperate migrants, coordinated by the 32 Caritas Centers.

The emerged faith community In the marriage of neighbors is quite Christ-like. The light of Polish Samaritan justice recalls the good works of so many in the Catholic Church. The Caritas Centers provide shelter, clothing, counseling, job placement, day care, and school placements. Dominican Sr. Margorite Lekan, and her sisters arranged a financial program in Krakow to help migrating young mothers with infants and small children.

600 Dominican nuns from everywhere traveled to Ukraine to help rescue them. Also in Krakow, Sisters of Charity brought families to their convent house. A network of convents and monasteries was set up through Ukraine to the Polish border. In Krakow, as shepherds, the nuns saved many lives. The Catholic Church and its nuns have been central in the relief effort for this massive migration. And the Polish people opened their hearts and their wallets.

Amazingly, in this magnitude of migration, there are no camps! Just a loving community. As Catholics, we can all be proud. This is the kind of Church Jesus would establish and lead.
