## Fr. Carl's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

Help! We are doing a wonderful Corporal Work of Mercy by offering showers to our migrant brothers and sisters living inside and outside the 15<sup>th</sup> District Police Station. They have time for showering, eating a simple breakfast together as a community, and getting clean clothes as needed. Folks have been very generous with volunteer time, sending clothes and helping with food. Here's where we could use some monetary help. The water bill has gone up significantly and is about \$4,800 for the last period of May through July. Any small or large donation will

help us with this added cost as we continue to care for those in need among us. Can you imagine if you could only shower or bathe two times a week? Watch for ways you can donate by using the QR code provided (see page 7 in this bulletin and look for the posters in church), dropping an envelope in the collection basket marked "Migrant Ministry," or even stopping at the parish office with your donation. Your help is needed and much appreciated.

These are such trying and stressful times for many, and kindness is needed more than ever. However, it seems like patience and kindness are lacking in many who seem very short-tempered these days. Perhaps to help make the world around us a better place, we need to consciously work at BEING MORE KIND and showing kindness to others. Here are a few suggestions to consider:

- Talk to strangers, especially people different from yourself. A simple "Hello, how are you?" can restore another's faith in humanity.
- Fast from unkind words. Use your words carefully to bless, heal, and bring peace.
- Let cars go in front of you in traffic.
- Let someone go ahead of you in the grocery store.
- Here's a challenging one: If someone at home or work makes you angry, leave that person a flower, a chocolate, or some little treat each day until you are over it. (This is a tough one for sure!)
- Light a candle each Sunday and pray for someone different each time.
- Choose a picture or an article from the paper and pray for the people involved.
- Take someone with whom you disagree to coffee and listen more than you talk.

The world in general and the world most immediately around us needs more kindness. Trying one of these suggestions may inspire others to be more kind. **Kindness starts with each one of us!**

#### Food For Thought A Reality of Tragedy

"Respect for Life means just that: the unborn, yes, and the elderly and the stranger, the migrant and the homeless person. Respect for Life includes the 'other,' no matter how defined—by gender, skin color, language, ethnicity an endless list." (NCR, P. Zagano, 8/28/23)

The report we write about documents how Saudi border guards had killed hundreds perhaps thousands—of Ethiopians seeking to cross the border from Yemen into Saudi Arabia. Laden with concussive force, the brutal accounts were so severe that it was difficult to read the details. A 14-year old girl described waking up after the attack: "I could feel people sleeping around me; Then I realized they were dead bodies."

These are defenseless children and unarmed people fleeing a savage conflict and relentless poverty, hoping for a chance at a life free of violence in one of the richest countries in the world. Given Saudi Arabia's record on human rights, mowing down defenseless women and children, how different is it from how Greek officials let a ship sink off their coast, filled with migrants?

The wanton disregard for the lives of migrants, right up to maximum deadly force, seems to be the norm. The European Union pays the murderous Libyan Coast Guard to prevent migrants from crossing the Mediterranean. Britain is sending its migrants to Rwanda! In this country, Gov. Abbott of Texas has strung barbarous devices across the Rio Grande; if the current doesn't drown them, the razor wire and saw blades will.

So what of this global assault on the dignity and lives of the migrants? The task of religion is to expand the conversation and model good behavior. The Church has stepped up to house immigrants, and there are places for unwanted children. But here and there is not enough. As the events in the Saudi desert illustrate, this century is going to be nasty and brutish and long.

What would Jesus say? He's already said it: "Now this is the judgment: the Light has come into the world, yet men have loved the darkness rather than the light; their works were evil. This is the will of my Father who sent me, that whoever beholds the Son, and believes in him, I will raise him up on the last day." (John 3:19-20; 6:40.)
