Fr. Carl's Corner



Recently, I presided at a well-attended funeral at church on the St. Giles campus. I said to one person how good it was to see them here in church, it has been some time since we last greeted each other. That person, without hesitation, admitted, "I've become very comfortable at home watching Mass on the livestream or the Cardinal's Mass. I have my cup of coffee and it's very comfortable and cozy!"

Believe me friends, I get that! But many (not enough, if truth be told) are back in the pews celebrating Eucharist as community. We all know others who are not and would give the same reason as the parishioner I recently encountered. Friends, it is time for us to reach out to family and others we know who are still "churching" on the couch at home! There are times when that is a good option, if we are sick or our own health is being compromised for some reason, whatever that might be. But nothing replaces the experience of the Eucharist and being together in person praying at Mass.

From here, we are sent forth to become the Body of Christ present in the community and in the world. We go forth to love and serve the Lord by our care for each other and the less fortunate among us.

A few weeks ago, I shared my experience at St. Mary-of-the-Woods, Indiana. I was delighted to hear from a woman who, after reading about my adventure there, shared with me that she had recently visited the college for her 60th class reunion. Those memories and relationships run deep! She also shared this beautiful prayer titled River of Grace, a favorite, written by one of the Sisters of Providence. I hope you will also enjoy this. It speaks to the pain and concerns of many in our communities and many on this planet we call home.

River of Grace

Let us gather up the tears of all times, all nations, all peoples, all children to form a river of grace to moisten, saturate, drench the hardness of hearts of stones turning them into hearts of flesh, into the heart of the God of providence.

Let us gather up the tears of all times to honor the grief of all generations, to honor the grief of the planet over what we have done to God's creation.

May all these tears become living water that nourishes the deep down roots of Love that births new life into the cosmos. May this living water pour down the justice, mercy and love of the heart of God.

Public Forum Discussing a proposed plan for social ministry outreach to Austin residents from the St. Catherine of Siena – St. Lucy Campus

Since January of 2023, at Fr. Carl Morello's direction, a group of volunteers from the Oak Park Catholic Community has been studying the feasibility of repurposing the unused rectory at St. Catherine – St. Lucy (SCSL) as a base for social ministry outreach to the residents of Austin. This initiative is a direct outgrowth of the third stated outcome of Renew My Church (RMC) for the Oak Park Catholic Community:

"The Archdiocese affirms the Oak Park grouping's vision to use St. Catherine – St. Lucy campus as a base for powerful ministry outreach to the West Side of Chicago... supported by the entire Oak Park Catholic community."

A primary motivation of the feasibility study is addressing the needs in Austin, beginning with SCSL School families. This project will be an OP Catholic Community response to our neighbors' identification of need. The RMC vision offers a unique opportunity to collectively provide this support.

The volunteer group recently submitted its feasibility report and recommendations to Fr. Carl, who in turn gave the report to Bishop Birmingham. Both Fr. Carl and Bishop Birmingham have encouraged the group to share its findings with the community for feedback before a final plan is developed.

The Feasibility Study Team will be holding a series of public forums throughout the community between early September and late November at a variety of locations and times in a deliberate effort to engage the community as fully as possible. The public forum will feature a 30-minute presentation by members of the Feasibility Study Team followed by a question-and-answer session to follow.

Notes from the Finance Committee Meeting

The combined Finance Committee met on Tuesday, September 5.

The Finance Committee welcomed a new member: Susan Charrette. Susan is a member of the Family Mass Community. She is currently a Spanish instructor but has also served as the Operations Manager for the Civic Federation, a Research Economist for the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, and a professor at Brown University. Susan has a PhD in Economics.

The committee reviewed the 2022-2023 Profit and Loss Statements for St. Catherine-St. Lucy and for St. Giles. In the unification process, the two legacy parishes are still using their own set of QuickBooks (accounting software) while waiting on the archdiocese for a combined QuickBooks which would streamline the process. In the meantime, the majority of the accounting for both campuses passes through the QuickBooks at St. Giles.

Some of the highlights from the meeting:

- the capital expenses at both campuses were reviewed with the recommendation that the Operations Director, Matt Brophy, break out the capital project expenditures for the last fiscal year for both campuses and also indicate the source of funds that paid for each project.
- the Sunday collection report will also list the weekly budget goal and indicate any shortfall or overage. The weekly budgeted Sunday Offertory goal is \$30,000. The parish has been running at an approximate deficit of \$6,000 per week. The forecasted annual parish deficit based on weekly giving is \$312,000 as well as a school operating deficit due to decreased enrollment.
- it was recommended that Sunday Mass attendance be listed in the weekly bulletin. It will be listed per Mass. Also listed will be the total donations received for any of our Second Collections.

In next week's bulletin, we will publish the information on the capital projects and sources of funds.


The Senior Corner



Food For Thought Lament and Tears

"Today God is calling us to work together In humility and love, to join hands so that the rivers can flow together, to become a mighty river of justice and peace, a river of worship and prayer, of lament and tears, of actions and stubborn hope.

And then in the power and the mighty spirit of God, we will see the face of the earth renewed for the sake of our children and children's children." (Rev. Rachel Mash, Environmental Coordinator of the Anglican Church)

This year the Season of Creation began September 1st, and will end with the release of an update to the Pope's landmark papal letter Laudato Si' on October 4th.

Pope Francis termed the new document an apostolic exhortation, an effort to "put an end to the senseless war against our common home."

The new piece comes after a summer of record-breaking temperatures, with deadly wildfires, storms and flooding. It will be released on the Feast Day of Francis of Assisi, last day of the yearly Season of Creation, and as backdrop to the first day of the Synod on Synodality, in Rome from October 4-29.

Francis hopes his environmental piece will influence deliberations on global response to climate change, COP 28, meeting in Dubai later this year. Might it influence the Synodal proceedings as well? There's been criticism of the Church's sparse enthusiasm for taking up the dire message of Laudato Si'.

Some influential U.S. bishops do not rank it among "culture wars," but in this Season of Creation, Bishops Gudziak and Malloy, Chairs of Domestic and International Justice and Peace Committees of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, urged Catholics to take up the cause of environmental action in the name of justice and peace.

The ecological conversion of hearts and changes in lifestyle are critical to our holiness, but public policy decisions will significantly change the course of our environmental future.


