Fr. Carl's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

The past fourteen months have been challenging and exciting times for our faith communities as we walk through the process of Building a New Reality in our church and parish communities.

I recently read that the Greek philosopher Heraclitus, six centuries before Christ, gave voice to the concept of the constancy of change. His famous words are "No man (or woman) ever steps into the same river twice."

Disney proclaims these words in a song from Pocahontas, "Just around the River Bend." Its lyrics, "You can't step in the same river twice, the waters always changing, always flowing." As we continue on the journey of Building a New Reality in our church communities, it would be helpful for us to reflect on this.

Each of us, especially those who long to hold onto what was, needs to remember that bit of wisdom. When one steps into the river and chooses to become stuck in the mud, the flow of the river and thus the life-giving water passes them by, leaving them behind.

Whether desired or not, leaving room for change in our lives is much needed. Allowing room for change will bring forth freshness within us. It's not easy embracing change constantly. However, it's interesting how many of us seem to embrace and enjoy the latest iPhone, yearning for the latest model when the old one still does the trick.

All life evolves and we celebrate this truth, constant change, in the liturgical year and in each academic year. We are different people as life forms us. People take on new roles and new titles. One day you're a young adult, then a fiancé, then a spouse, then a parent! You cannot go back.

Every river bend has a purpose. We learn something new about ourselves at each turn and have something different to give as well. We have challenges and opportunities ahead of us. Let's keep in mind that there is no stepping back to the river that once was, as it has flowed onward.

Our Feasibility Study group has had two meetings sharing information about repurposing the Rectory at the St. Catherine-St. Lucy site for ongoing ministry. Check the schedule (see page 4) for a date when you can come and listen, ask questions and share your feedback. Your thoughts do matter to us!

Last weekend, the united Religious Education Program (RE) began and is off to a good start. Other than some folks looking for an unfamiliar building on one of our campus sites, most of the feedback was positive. Public Forum

Discussing a proposed plan for social ministry outreach to Austin residents from St. Catherine – St. Lucy Campus

Since January 2023, at Fr. Carl Morello's direction, a group of volunteers from the Oak Park Catholic Community has been studying the feasibility of repurposing the unused rectory at St. Catherine – St. Lucy (SCSL) as a base for social ministry outreach to the residents of Austin. This initiative is a direct outgrowth of the third stated outcome of Renew My Church for the Oak Park Catholic community:

“The Archdiocese affirms the Oak Park grouping’s vision to use St. Catherine – St. Lucy campus as a base for powerful ministry outreach to the West Side of Chicago... supported by the entire Oak Park Catholic community.”

A primary motivation of the Feasibility Study is addressing the needs in Austin, beginning with SCSL School families. This project will be an OP Catholic Community response to our neighbors' identification of need. The Renew My Church vision offers a unique opportunity to collectively provide this support.

The volunteer group recently submitted its Feasibility Report and recommendations to Fr. Carl, who in turn gave the report to Bishop Birmingham. Both Fr. Carl and Bishop Birmingham have encouraged the group to share its findings with the community for feedback before a final plan is developed.

The Feasibility Study Team will be holding a series of public forums throughout the community between early September and late November at a variety of locations and times in a deliberate effort to engage the community as fully as possible. The public forum will feature a 30-minute presentation by members of the Feasibility Study Team followed by a question-and-answer session.
