

## Fr. Carl's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel the workers gather to receive their day's wage. They are surprised, we are told, to learn that the wage promised them is not based on merit but based on generosity and love. They are surprised to realize that they are part of a bigger circle of God's love, his kingdom. For many of us, God's circular love looks flat and straight and even unfair at times. Just as one needs to be high above the earth to see its curve and higher still to see it as a full circle, our faith calls us to trust that God's kingdom is not about straight lines but about the circle that is God's all-embracing and eternal love. Here, the first are last and the last are first and love is a gift God freely gives us without exception and without end.

Our Gospel lesson today reminds us of this truth, no matter what we might see or experience in life, we live in that circle that is God's all-embracing and eternal love.

What a gift it is to have this faith, and trust it, wherever we are on our journey in life!

Some things you should know:

The St. Catherine-St. Lucy and St. Giles' newly formed Parish Council met for the second time on Monday, September 18. 

#### The Music Box

Last week, we shared some pictures and information about pipe removal from the St. Giles organ chambers by the Berghaus Organ company.

This week, we would like to tell you about the pipes that we received from Second Church, Christ Scientist in Lakeview. All the pipes are in the process of being cleaned, repaired or replaced as necessary. The records list the Lakeview organ as being Austin Opus 1646, built in 1928. Through the restoration process at Berghaus, our builders have discovered that the organ was most likely a re-build when it was installed in 1928. They know this because each pipe is marked as Opus 525 and is stamped by the pipe maker, Alfred Peterson, who was an excellent pipe maker who used high quality metal. Our technicians at Berghaus are reasonably certain the pipes were made prior to 1910 based on the metal and the style of construction.

#### FOOD COLLECTION FOR THOSE IN NEED



## Living the Mass: How Liturgy Shapes Our Lives

Each Sunday at the end of Mass, we are sent out on mission! The priest or deacon announces: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life" challenging us to deeply live out our faith in the world. "Liturgical spirituality" brings together liturgy and spirituality by examining how our lives are formed and nurtured by the Church's liturgy, how our "being" in the world is shaped by the way we worship. This year, the Oak Park Catholic Community will be invited to explore Liturgical Spirituality through a ten-part speaker series. ## Public Forum Discussing a proposed plan for social ministry outreach to Austin residents from St. Catherine – St. Lucy campus

Since January of 2023, at Fr. Carl Morello's direction, a group of volunteers from the Oak Park Catholic Community has been studying the feasibility of repurposing the unused rectory at St. Catherine – St. Lucy (SCSL) as a base for social ministry outreach to the residents of Austin. This initiative is a direct outgrowth of the third stated outcome of Renew My Church for the Oak Park Catholic Community:

"The Archdiocese affirms the Oak Park grouping's vision to use St. Catherine – St. Lucy campus as a base for powerful ministry outreach to the West Side of Chicago... supported by the entire Oak Park Catholic community."

A primary motivation of the Feasibility Study is addressing the needs in Austin, beginning with SCSL School families. This project will be an OP Catholic Community response to our neighbors' identification of need. The Renew My Church vision offers a unique opportunity to collectively provide this support.

The volunteer group recently submitted its Feasibility Report to Fr. Carl, who has encouraged the group to share its findings with the community for feedback before a final plan is developed.

The Feasibility Study Team is holding a series of public forums throughout the community from now until late November at a variety of locations and times to engage the community as fully as possible. The public forum will feature a 30-minute presentation by members of the Feasibility Study Team followed by a question-and-answer session.






#### St. Catherine-St. Lucy Halloween Bake Sale October 29



#### Facility Updates for St. Catherine- St. Lucy (September 2023)

The Rectory boiler installation has been completed. It's a high efficiency furnace that required a new chimney flue and intake for the boiler. The next step is to manually bleed the air out of every radiator in the building so that the boiler is

operating at full capacity.



Both the storm sewer and the sanitary sewer lines were cracked. Most of the sewer problems were caused by the tree that's in the church courtyard.

The plumbers were able to camera from the clean out in the newest section of pipes about 30 feet east toward Austin Blvd. Unfortunately, there is a second section of collapsed storm sewer that runs under the walkway on the south side of the Church. At the time of this publication, three plumbing companies have

looked at the site and scoped out the work that needs to be done but only one proposal has been submitted. In order to proceed, the Archdiocese requires three written proposals for a job of this size. Therefore, we must wait for the other two proposals before a decision to complete the repairs is made. Operations Director, Matthew Brophy, has asked that the Archdiocese provide financial assistance to cover the cost of the second sewer repair.

The School, former Convent and Church are all heated by two boilers in the boiler house located behind the former Convent. There are approximately 30 heating tubes in each boiler that need to be cleaned yearly for proper maintenance. Operations Director, Matthew Brophy, had three boiler companies provide estimates on the repair of one boiler that had 11 leaking tubes and the rebuilding of the refractory walls. The 11 new pipes were installed, and the refractory walls were rebuilt the week of September 11. The next step is the cleaning of each boiler and realigning the flames. Both boilers will be fully ready and operational the week of September 25. The boiler in the Gym will also be cleaned and serviced for the upcoming heating season.

As we end the month of September, the parking lot has been completed, roofs have been repaired, a new boiler was installed for the Rectory, the main boilers were repaired and cleaned for the School and the Gym, additional WIFI access was added to the

Rectory, new sump pumps were installed in the Rectory and the Church, new sections of the storm sewers were replaced and a few other smaller projects around the campus. This past winter, LED lighting was installed in the Church, upgrades were made to the sound system including new wireless microphones for the deacon and the priest. Recently, it was brought to my attention that there are some concerns about the caulking around the Church windows that need to be assessed before winter sets in.





  - Site captains recruit and manage a team of volunteers from their congregation to fill volunteer needs and/or meals for a night of shelter operation.
- Evening Shelter Host (6:30 pm-10:00 pm)
  Volunteers help get set-up for the evening, greet the shelter guests as they arrive help them to set up their sleeping area, host dinner, and interact with clients until lights out.
- Overnight Attendant (10:00 pm-5:00 am)
  Volunteers support staff in ensuring a safe experience for the shelter guests.
- > Breakfast Host (5:00 am-7:00 am)
  Volunteers serve a light breakfast, help shelter guests exit and assist with light clean-up.
- Meal Provider (To be delivered at 7:00 pm)

## Food For Thought The Joy of Living Generously

"Lord Jesus, teach me to be generous...
to give and not to count the cost,
to fight and not to heed the wounds,
to labor and not to seek reward,
except that of knowing that I do your will."
(Prayer of St. Ignatius)

The laborers who worked all day in the landlord's vineyard, grumbled when all workers were paid the same, no matter how many hours worked. This parable can make people feel resentful, but it calls for us to give thanks for what we receive from God. Other people's rewards do not diminish our own. We're reminded by Isaiah that God is generous with mercy, in ways that are well beyond our imagination.

This parable can disturb us:
Is it fair? Does heaven run on
this sort of rule? Really, why work
all day, while others working just
an hour receive the same reward?
But—one line in this parable
is key to understanding it.
In reply to those disgruntled,
who bore the burden and the heat,
the owner asked, "Are you envious
Because I am so generous?"
He'd focused on the common good,
not just on the work.

Jesus had said this parable spoke of the kingdom of heaven. Sometimes we look at religion as a transactional .affair. If we do good, we'll see rewards. But in heaven, the system's not transactional. The owner in the parable cares for workers and the vineyard—he's an owner to be trusted. In St. Paul's words, he looks for people who will live for something more than just themselves, who'll be one with God.

Isaiah left us asking how to find God. And this parable suggests doing God's work reveals who God is, and draws us into the joy of living generously.

## Spiritual Classics October Discussion on the Writings of Saint Francis

In connection with the Feast of Saint Francis in October, our next Spiritual Classics discussion will be on the Writings of Saint Francis, to be held on Thursday, October 5, 2023 at 7:30 pm in the Ascension Parish Center Dining Room. Our own Father Bob Hutmacher, OFM, will lead the discussion. Please note we are meeting on Thursday this month.

Saint Francis, the patron saint of Italy, animals, and ecology, founded the Order of the Friars Minor. He, more than anyone, imitated Christ in his own life, living in poverty and giving to everyone in need. He had thousands of devoted followers. His writings are part of his legacy to Christians all over the world.

Our discussion on October 5 will focus on significant writings and prayers of Saint Francis.
